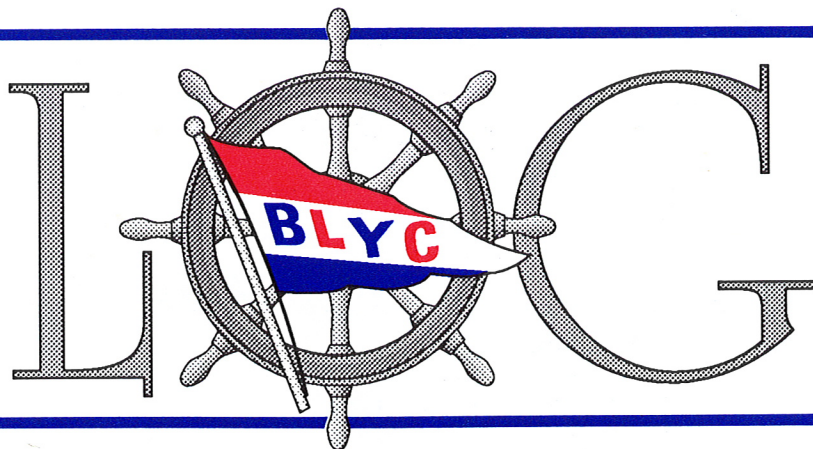

If you haven't been here— you should try it!

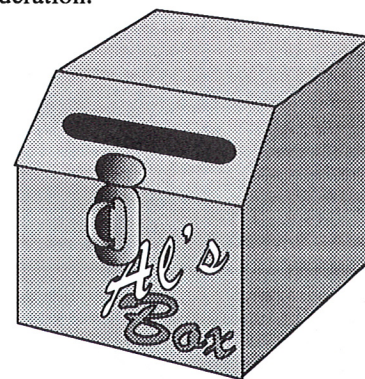
When I first became Commodore, a fellow member, **Fred Rosser**, made a box which is on the front table with a pad and pencil. Fred

BLYC CARIBBEAN CRUISE 1993

If you haven't been on a Caribbean cruise, you have heard about them all your life, and that they are the perfect vacation. If you have been before, then you will want to go again. With our group discount, we will never go for less money. The Board of Governors decided to propose to the membership a Yacht Club Caribbean Cruise for this winter. This cruise will be open to all members, family members, and friends.

After considering all the ships, ports of call and dates the "SOVEREIGN OF THE SEAS" the Eastern Caribbean and the departure date of March 6, 1993 were selected. Forty (40) cabins have been reserved on the Main Deck (Dining Room Level). This number can be increased or decreased.

The price of the cruise that has been discussed does not include air fare, as many of our members live, winter, or vacation in Florida. Also two or three couples may want to drive to Florida in one vehicle to reduce expenses. The price of a cruise depends on the deck selected and whether you select inside or outside cabins. The only difference in the cabins is that the outside cabins have windows (portholes). There is \$100/person difference, and don't forget not much time is spent in the cabin other than for sleeping. These cabins have two lower beds, radio and television, telephone, and private shower facilities. This price also depends on the number of persons for the group discount. Group discounts make a big difference in the price of a cruise. With groups of 50, the reduced price will be approximately \$900-\$1,000 per person/double occupancy. A \$25.00 per person deposit is required for a reservation and with a \$200 per person deposit cabin numbers will be assigned. These deposits are refundable if cancellation is made 30 days prior to departure. With our group reservation, the travel agency will arrange for a private Buckeye Lake Yacht Club party on Sunday night.

With Royal Caribbean's Air/Sea Program add-on your cruise becomes a complete vacation package. One reservation takes care of all arrangements for your cruise, air fare and transfers. The cost of this add-on package is \$300/person. If you wish to arrive a day before your cruise is to depart there is a Pre-Cruise Package available at an additional fee of \$49.00 per person/double occupancy. This package includes one night at a hotel in Miami and transportation to the hotel and ship.

Join us this winter on the '93 Yacht Club Cruise. It can be a lot of fun and a chance to get away from the Midwest drab winter days. Upon return, Spring will be around the corner and boating on Buckeye Lake will again return.

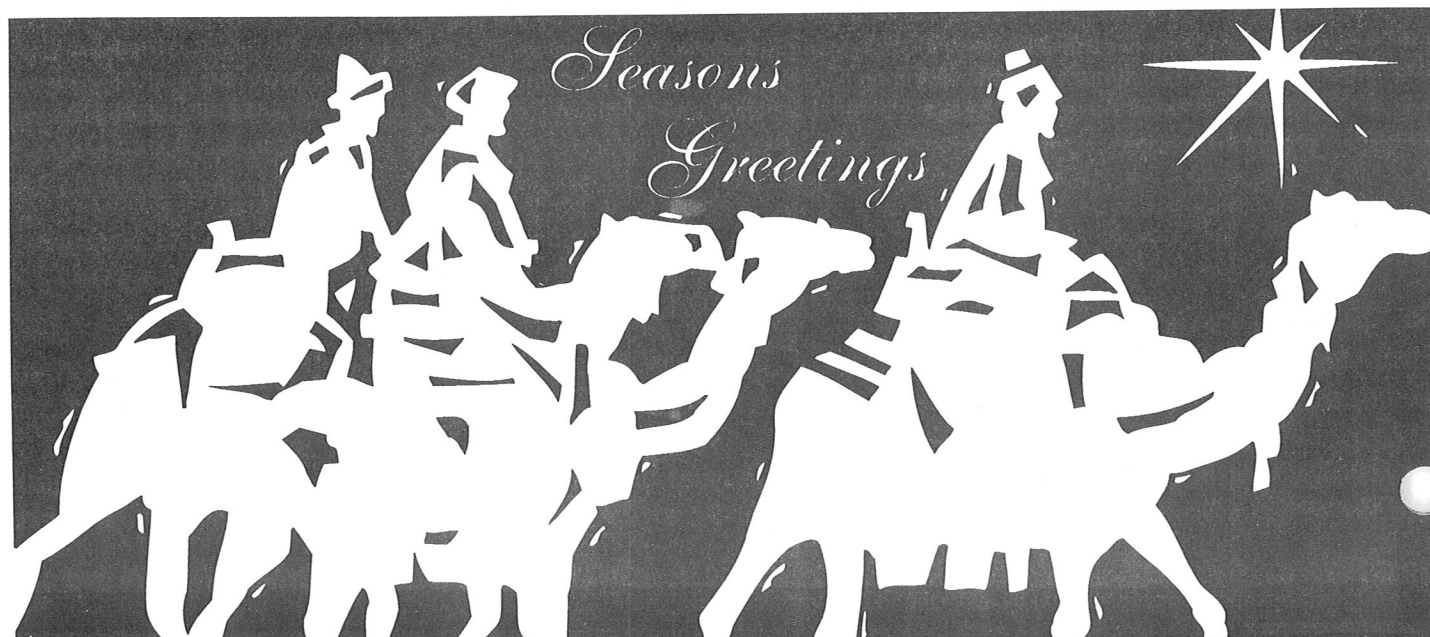


