

If you haven't been here—you should try it!


When I first became Commodore, a fellow member, Fred Rosser, made a box which is on the front table with a pad and pencil. Fred

With the three sailboats that are owned by the Club stored for the winter, the Race and Regatta & Jr. Training Governor is now planning for spring and the following summer and fall events.


