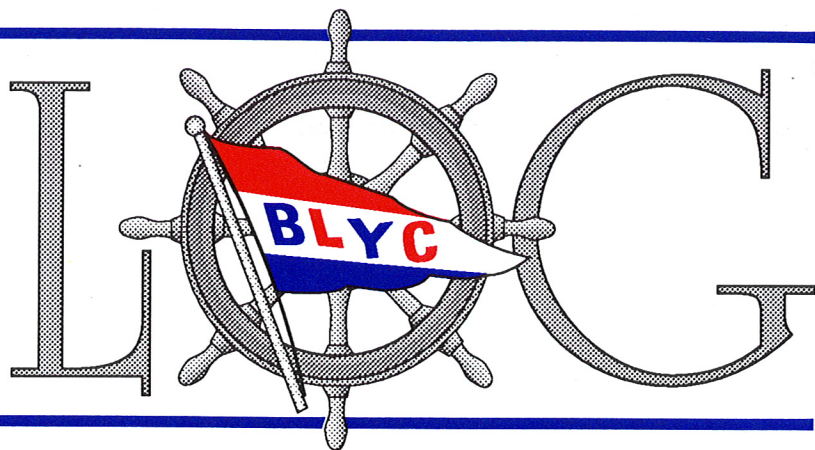

He was a man of high principles and convictions who never hesitated to stand up for what he believed to be right.

Every day that I was on the road with a lot of time to think about what I would write, I was continually connecting Mike's untimely death with the recent premature deaths of two close friends (including Homer Tussing last May) and the not so recent but also premature deaths of my best friend, my youngest brother and an older sister, all of whom were very dear to me, in another relatively short time frame many years ago.

All of this has (belatedly perhaps) brought home to me the fragility of life in a very personal way. I have never been one to make New Year's resolutions, but this year I do resolve to cherish to the fullest all of the friendships I enjoy. When Maxine and I gather with friends at the Club on New Year's Eve, I know that all of us will be thinking of our dear friend, Mike Hein, when the last notes of *Auld Lang Syne* are sung.
