

PROFESSIONAL POWER BOAT RACING...

...at Buckeye Lake on June 18, 19 & 20, 1993.

veryone has heard a lot of rumors concerning the power boat racing on Buckeye Lake. I hope the following information answers any questions you may have.

About 3 months ago, I was doing my job at the Yacht Club on a Sunday afternoon and a man named Joe Hill walked in and began asking questions about the area of Buckeye Lake. He told me that he was a sports

promoter and was looking into the possibility of holding a power boat racing event on the lake.

As he described the event, I thought how nice it would be for the village of Buckeye Lake as well as the lake itself. I supplied him with the names of the Village officials as well as the lake administrators. He walked down the North Bank along the sidewalk and I showed him the area and the Yacht Club facilities. From there I was asked to sit on a steering committee of about 10 people to help this event take the right direction for this area.

The boats that will be racing are referred to as "tunnel hull" racing ats. They are powered by outboard engines that propel them to speeds up to 110 MPH and from zero to 100 MPH in 5 seconds which makes them the quickest (but not the fastest) boats in the world. There are going to be three classes of boats with about 15 boats in each class. The race course consists of an oval shaped course approximately 1 mile in circumference. The course layout will be from in front of the new North Shore State Park to in front of the Yacht Club.

These boats start from a "dead" engine start, which means their engines are off. This will occur at the Yacht Club along the south seawall of the BLYC docks (at the wind sock). They will race to the first mark in front of the Club and around the course about 25 times, and then finish. Each race lasts 15 to 20 minutes. There are several races for each class and the finishing positions are awarded points which accumulate over the 2 days of racing. The winner is the boat with the best point total for all the races combined.

Questions & Answers

- Q. How many people do they expect to see this event?
- A. Depending on the weather anywhere from 20,000 to 60,000 people over the 3 day period.
- Q. Where are they going to put all those people?

The public will be viewing from the State Park which will be closed to all boat and car traffic for the weekend. They will also be viewing from the North Bank sidewalk from the State Park to the Yacht Club. There will also be bleachers set up as well as concession stands on John Carlin's empty property between the BLYC Eastport

Boatyard facility and the State Park. The parking for all the public will be at remote areas around the Village and they will be bussed by vans provided by Pay Less Rent-a-Car. They will be letting people off at the State Park.

Q. Will the public be allowed to use any of the Yacht Club Facilities?

A. ABSOLUTELY NOT. Access to the Yacht Club facilities will be limited and they will be used as follows:

Island and Parking Lot - Access to parking and the Island will be restricted to Yacht Club members, Media, Sponsors, and Boat drivers only. Special passes will be distributed to the media, the sponsors, and the drivers. Yacht Club members can use their membership cards to get onto the island and to park in the parking lot. Please bring them with you!!! A uniformed police officer will be at the front gate all weekend restricting access.

Eastport Boatyard - The Boatyard will be closed to all traffic that weekend. Please do not plan to use the lift or to access your boat that weekend. The reason it will be closed is because that is where the racing boats will be stored as well as launched. They will be using our hoist and another crane being brought in to lift the boats into the water.

The Front Basin where the guest docks are located will not only be closed to all traffic but will be completely blocked by the same barge that we had at the Club for the Danger Brothers to play on last year. Phil Dirt and the Dozers will be playing on that barge Friday June 18. The barge will be put into position Thursday, June 17, 1993 and will remain there all weekend. If you have a boat in the Front Basin and think you might want to use it that weekend you will want to remove it before Thursday, June 17, 1993.

The outside perimeter of the island will also be closed to boat parking on Saturday and Sunday for safety reasons during the races.

- Q. Will I be able to do any boating on the lake that weekend?
- A. Yes. However, boat traffic will be limited around the race course area including all docks that the BLYC owns. Boat traffic will only be permitted in certain areas and only during certain times over the entire weekend.
- Q. Can I bring my friends to the Yacht Club that weekend to watch the races?

A. Yes. However, on Friday night for the Phil Dirt concert, only presale ticket holders will be allowed on the island after 5:00 p.m. Tickets are available at the Club but only a limited number are still available. The price is \$12.00 per person. Members can bring guests, but, to keep the public from coming onto the island on Saturday and Sunday, the guests must be accompanied by a member with a valid BLYC membership card.


