

Did you see our First Place boat in the July 4th parade? It appeared on channel 10 that evening and also on the front page of the Advocate.



CHANGE IN THE CLASSIFICATION OF THE BLYC LIQUOR PERMIT

In November, 1992, the Board of Governors authorized a review of the legal status of the BLYC liquor permit.

The permit specified that "sale of beer or liquor to non-members is illegal." The unauthorized sale of beer or liquor to individuals is punishable by up to six months incarceration and a \$1,000 fine for the person or persons authorizing the sale or the person making the sale. Further, such a violation is reported to the Ohio Dept. of Liquor Control which could lead to the suspension or revocation of the permit. Because of these potential problems, re-

search into the possibility of obtaining a permit allowing sales to non-members was begun. One type of permit, known as a "Marina License" was found. Only twelve of these licenses were available state-wide, with no more than two to be issued in any one county.

To obtain the license it had to be shown that the Club had 25 or more docks, 2,500 square feet of floor area, obtained 50% or more of its revenue from food service and was located on a navigable river. To

demonstrate navigability it must be established that inter state commence is conducted on the river. A river is defined as a "waterway". With historical background provided by Chance Brockway, I argued to the Board that the Ohio-Erie Canal wa waterway upon which inter-state commence was conducted. I provided two U.S. Supreme Court cases which established that once a river has been determined to be "navigable" it retains its character of navigability. Finally I established that BLYC was located on what was once known as the Licking Summit Reservoir which was a critical part of the Ohio-Erie Canal.

After numerous meetings with Liquor Board personnel and in depth investigation of the Club premises, the new Marina License was made available. On the day I was to surrender the old license and obtain the new license I was informed the new license would not permit Sunday beer sales.

The Board in a telephone conference weighed the long term benefit of the new permit against the risk of concealing it to keep Sunday beer sales. It was not an easy decision. In the final analysis, however, it is best that there be no question about the legality of our operations.

Now the objective is to find the most cost effective way to obtain the permit needed for Sunday sales.


