
were watching the races. Many of the races had strong winds which damaged some boats, but Walter and Kevin stayed in the race to the end.



This edition will serve as my current report and a summary of my first year as Governor of BLYC. I have not had reports in the Log on a regular monthly basis because of the nature of the job.

Some of you may not know what the duties of the Off Island Governor consist of. They are spread over a large area. I have been in charge of the maintenance of: the Rosebaugh House, the Ranch House, the 4 unit apartment at East Port, East port storage lot, all docks, parking lot, and walks.

It may sound like a lot but I am sure it has not demanded as much of my time as some of the other Governors. However it has been a great learning experience and I have gained a lot of insight into the operation of the Club. From this experience I think we need to spend more effort on future long range planning.

As an example, the 4 unit apartment is becoming a deteriorated liability. We have been studying the cost of repair vs. demolition. Some interesting ideas have surfaced in the discussions. Just ideas: Tear down the building, increase the size of the fenced lot, more boat storage, consider an enclosed pole barn type storage unit to provide covered boat storage (increase rental income), or simply close the apartments and let the building set for a while.

July Work day—Yes, we had a work day, July 24. A big thanks to all the Governors who showed up to work along with two members Dave Sutton and Don Hoskinson. Repairs were done on the Rosebaugh house, and the two room Out House was removed making room for a future move to a new drive way entrance. The number of members who showed up for work days may be an indication that the Board in the future should consider putting more money into maintenance accounts and hire more of the work done. Any input from the members on this subject would be appreciated. It is understandable why members do not enjoy spending their weekend doing Club work. With all of the property that the Club owns, it requires ongoing repairs.



In all it has been a great year for me and I hope to continue to work for the future of the BLYC Club.
