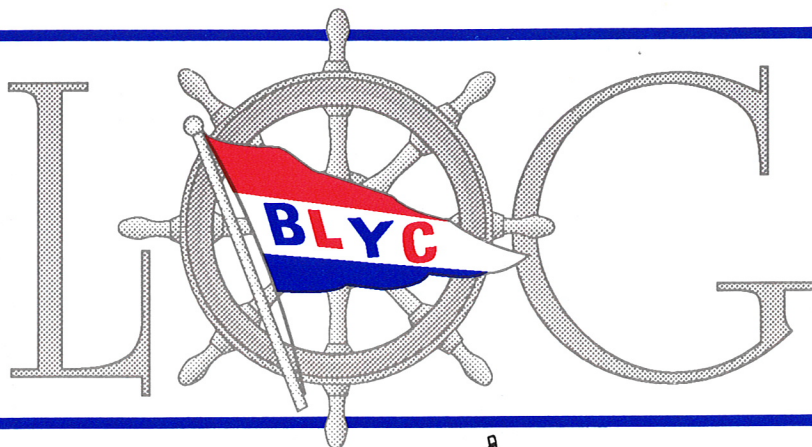

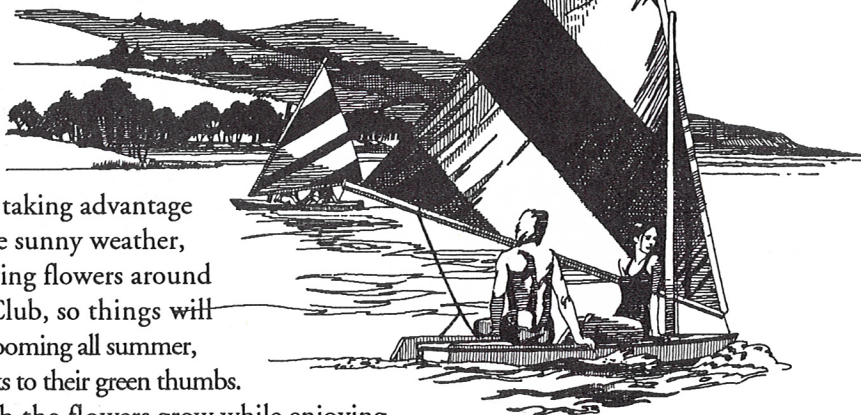
FROM THE BRIDGE ☆ ☆ ☆

As most of you know by now Issue 19, the Sunday liquor sales option, passed. The vote total was 127 for and 75 against. The total number of voters was 207 so nearly all voters voted on this issue.

I estimate that we received at least 50 votes from individuals in the community of Buckeye Lake who are not BLYC members or spouses. We obviously owe a great debt of gratitude to the Buckeye Lake community. When the opportunity arises, I hope that you will assist me in volunteering in some way to repay this debt.

The effort to be certain that we had the proper liquor permit was initiated in November, 1992, by Commodore Al Wing. Now I am proud to say that BLYC is legally permitted to sell liquor to members and non-members seven days per week within certain posted hours. We are the only establishment on the main lake that has Sunday sales of liquor.

Again, my sincere thanks to all who assisted in this campaign and all who voted in favor of Issue 19.

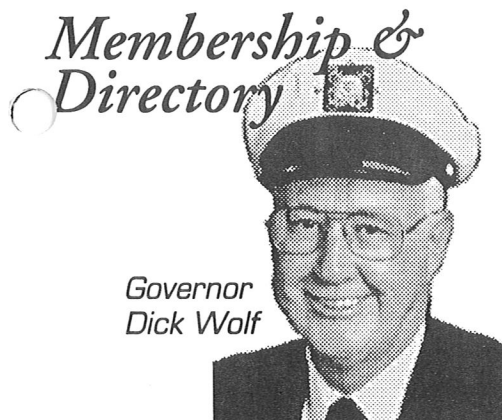

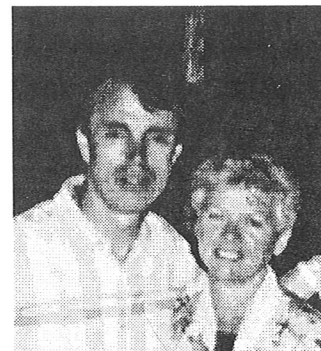

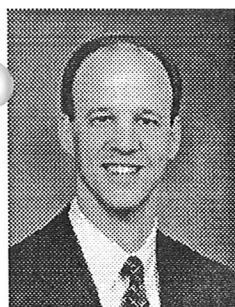

Summer boating season is finally here! The Yacht Club has paid for 103 boat docks. There are still about a dozen to be assigned. The following boat docks are still available: (Please refer to page 4 of the May issue of the Log). Docks 4, 6, 7, 20, 49A, 53A, 66, 86, 108, 109, 111, 113, and 115.

Following my article you will find the Dock Waiting List Report as of Sunday, May 22, 1994. I have attempted to reach people at the top of this list that have requested open docks. Many times I have been unsuccessful. If you are near the top of the list, please call me. Many of the docks mentioned are docks that several people do not want. If you are anywhere on this list and you are interested in dock 4, 6, 7, 20, 49A, 53A, 108 or 109, please call me.

There has been much discussion in the Board of Governors' Meetings relative to the image of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. The policy established by the Board of Governors is to EITHER USE THE DOCK OR LOSE IT". As you will see by the number of people on the waiting list, there are people desiring docks and it is unfair to these members to have a member have a dock and not use it. This means that the boat must have its winter cover removed and the planks under the boats removed. Although there is no rule in the By-laws as to the frequency that you must use your boat, the intent is that the dock should not be used as a summer storage area (Eastport Boatyard is for this purpose). The other criticism that the Board of Governors has heard is that some of the

boats are not kept up". This means they should be washed down so they do not accumulate spiders and insects and they should be kept in good repair. Not only does a boat that is not kept up reflect upon the Yacht Club, it also reflects upon the person to whom the dock is rented. I have been instructed to send letters to those who violate this policy.

The covered dock roofs will be

painted this summer and the missing dock light fixtures have been ordered and will be installed as soon as they are received.

Let's have fun boating this summer!

take place in late May or at the latest mid June. If you have experienced the bump coming off the drive, rest assured that it will be eliminated before paving.

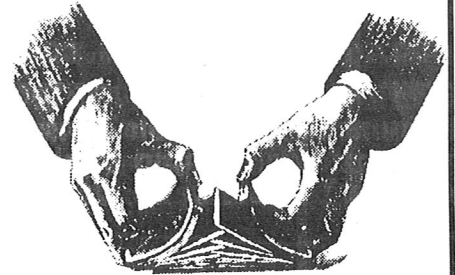
Take a look at the ideas for new entrance signs and let me know what you think. They are on display behind the Bar.
