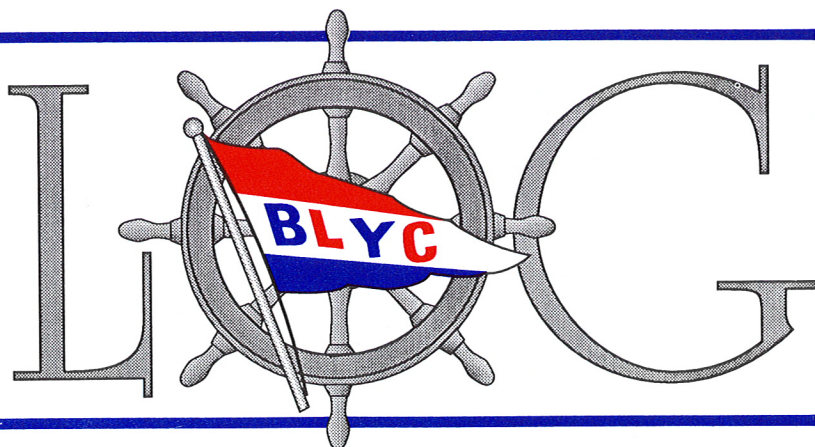

To John Geiger and Steve Becker, I encourage you both to run again next year.

As for the last year, congratulations are in order for Steve Schilling and his board for a fine year of progress and achievement. We will miss Commodore Dick Wolf, and Governors Jim Fedor, Tim Ryan, Dwight Joseph and Steve Rehbein-Beeson who elected not to run this year. A major portion of the success of the Board last year was due to the contributions of these officers.

For those members who have not

yet heard the results of the recent referendum of the membership on the question of allowing women to apply for and become members of the Club, the votes were tallied by a group of former Commodores of both persuasions on September 12th. The results are as follows:

1) Of the 372 Active, Life and Perpetual members polled, some 80% responded.

2) Of the responding members, approximately 60% voted against women membership and approximately 40% voted for women membership.

At the regularly scheduled board meeting on September 14th, the Board acknowledged the results of the referendum and voted not to take any action to change the Club By-Laws which currently prevent women from becoming

members of the Club.

As for the next year, we have a fine Board and a new Club Manager who are eager to get to work. It looks like a year of opportunity. The unexpectedly large influx of new members this last year has provided a good sized carry over of capital improvement funds and none too soon. The Club House is in bad need of maintenance in some critical areas and the Long Range Planning Committee has recommended some major improvements to make more efficient use of our facilities. These recommendations will be given a harder look during the next six months and a full fledged detailed plan will be presented to the membership at the Spring Semi-Annual meeting. In the meantime, look for some improvements in the Bar and Kitchen facilities.

Some major strides have been made in cleaning up the Club, both inside and out, and with the help of Hans and the membership, more progress will be made. The plan to clean out the Club 'basement' this next Work Day is a good example.

The Club has reached the point where it needs to be run in a more businesslike manner. We have a professionally trained Manager that we should provide with the proper administrative tools to perform the job. An office with basic office equipment and a part time administrative assistant is a reasonable start.

In response to a number of legitimate complaints, I plan to begin enforcement of the guest limitations specified in the Club By-Laws. The frequency which members bring the same guests will be monitored and members who abuse the rules will be notified. To this end, I will work with the Board and the Club Manager to see that the intent of the By-Laws in this area are complied with.

The Suggestion Box will soon reappear and I invite members to submit constructive suggestions and legitimate

complaints to the Board by dropping them in the Box. We will do our best to respond to you personally for each signed suggestion/complaint.

I wish to thank each member for the support I have received to date and for the support I hope to receive in the coming year.

of the club's needs after the clean up.

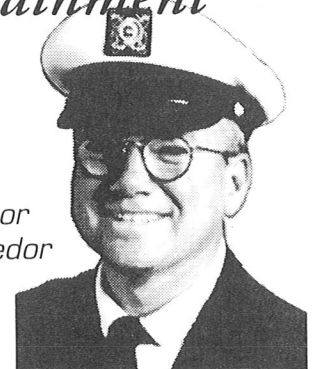
So come on out on October the 16th and help us prepare the Club for the winter season.
