


hope everyone has enjoyed the unusually great weather we've had in the last month as much as I have. To be able to continue the boating and other outdoor activities at this time of the year is a real bonus. And speaking of bonuses how about the OSU Band Party? Great party followed by a convincing win over Michigan and great weather. How could you have a better November?

With December upon us again, we have not only the holidays coming, but it is once more time for your board to finalize the Club's budget, which also scludes reviewing the dues structure for the coming year. Dues represent only about 45% of the year's revenue with Bar & Kitchen about 48% and rentals about 7%. However, since food and

drink prices are set so as to cover the cost of operating the restaurant and bar, the many expenses incurred in operating the remainder of the club functions must be covered by the dues and rentals. In the past several years, the board has involved itself in promoting private non-member parties at the Club on a non-interference basis and summer concerts open to the public as a means of providing additional revenues for club operation without the need for raising dues. In addition the summer concerts provided an entertainment opportunity which the club could not otherwise afford to give its members.

There are pros and cons to these non-member activities. The cons include opening the doors of the club to the public and using the club in a manner contrary to its charter. The pros include being able to provide the membership with a higher level of service and activities at lower dues, food and drink prices than would be required without these non-member activities. Any reduction in non-member activities would necessarily mean an increase in dues, food and/or drink prices (maybe a monthly minimum as an alternative) or a reduction in the level of services and activities of the membership. There appear to be three basic alternatives:

- 1. Continue non-member activities and maintain the current level of member service/activities. This results in no major dues increase.
- 2. Reduce/curtail non-member activities and maintain the current level of member service/activities. This results

in an attendant increase in dues, food and/or drink prices (or a monthly minimum).

3. Reduce/curtail non-member activities and reduce or curtail member services and activities. This results in no major dues increase but does adversely effect the service and activities that our members currently enjoy.

If you wish to express your personal preference to the board prior to the next board meeting, mark your preference - 1, 2 or 3 - on the ballot below, clip it out and put it in the Suggestion Box before the 12th of December.


We found the Yacht Club members on the island very warm and gracious. We certainly would recommend our members go and visit the Club if they are vacationing on the Island.
