

New Year, the Super Bowl, and some serious winter weather to anticipate. Where does the time go? Seems like last week we were boating and looking forward to the Luau. The Christmas holidays, however, are one of the nicest times of the year and the Club did look great. Our staff including Andrea, Kim, Nancy and Betty, were responsible for the outstanding decorating job. Thanks, ladies.

One of the subjects considered by your Board this last month was the scheduling of next year's Oktoberfest in the grassy parking area for two days and opening the event to the public. The committee appointed to investigate the business aspects of the event reported to the Board at the last meeting. After due deliberation, the Board opted not to

schedule the larger public event due to 1) the risk of the revenues not covering the expenses involved, and 2) adding another event that opened the Club to the public. Look for an expanded member/guest Oktoberfest for next year.

For those of you interested, the results of last month's poll regarding the trade-off of annual dues, the scheduling of non-member activities as a source of revenue and the level of member services/activities, is as follows:

a) the vote split almost equally between option #1 continuing the current level of non-member activities and dues levels and option #2 - reducing the current level of non-member activities and increasing dues/prices (or setting a monthly minimum)

b) only one vote was received suggesting reduction in both non-member activity and member service/activity

Annual billing for dues and dock rentals will have been mailed by the time you read this Log. The Board has seen fit to raise the annual dues for the Active Members by \$25.00 per year and the initiation fee for new members to \$1500.00. These increases are necessary primarily because of the higher levels of facility maintenance we have planned this year. Relatively little has been spent on maintenance of the Club's facilities since the parking lot was purchased five years ago. This year we have had to begin some sorely needed upkeep most of which is not apparent to the casual observer, furnace replacement, re-roofing part of the first story, replacement of certain kitchen appliances, refurbishment of some of the rental property, etc. Not glamorous but necessary. So bear with your Board while they do the right thing for the Club. Just a reminder - all billed charges should be paid within 30 days of the billing date. Please help us keep the Club's finances current.

The big announcement this month is that the Club will be open during the month of January (look for the details inside). Although Hans will be vacationing in Germany this month, with Marguerite in the kitchen, Andrea at the bar and your Board watching, we don't anticipate any problems providing normal service to the members. So don't miss the Ice Breaker, the special dinner night and, if you're a football fan, the Super Bowl party.

Stainless steel kick panels have been installed on the swinging door to the kitchen in the bar area. The return air grilles by the popcorn machine and the fireplace have been installed.
