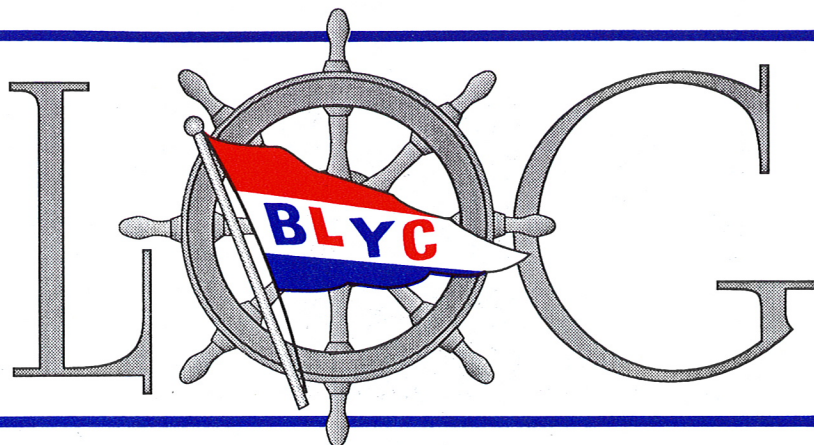

The annual billing for dues assessments and rental fees was mailed a little late - on Monday January 9th - and is due by February 10th. The total amount billed out was just over \$200,000 and provides most of the operating funds for all the major activities of the Club except for the Bar and Restaurant (which pretty much pays for itself from its own revenues). This means that all capital improvement projects like the purchase of the parking lot and the addition of the front entrance, all maintenance of the club property, operation of the pool, the entertainment groups that play for our parties, printing and mailing of the Log/directory/flyers, utility expenses, real estate taxes, insurance, sailing events, Junior Training, dock licenses, salaries for the Manager and the clean-up personnel, etc. are paid

from these annual billings. All in all, the members get a lot for their money. So being punctual in paying your annual share will be greatly appreciated by your Board.

The decision to keep the Club open in January was a good one and we have had more than expected turn-outs for the monthly activities. We had a couple of football parties that were enjoyed by all except the 'sore losers', a great Steak and Wine Nite, and a Karaoke Ice-breaker that went into the wee hours. 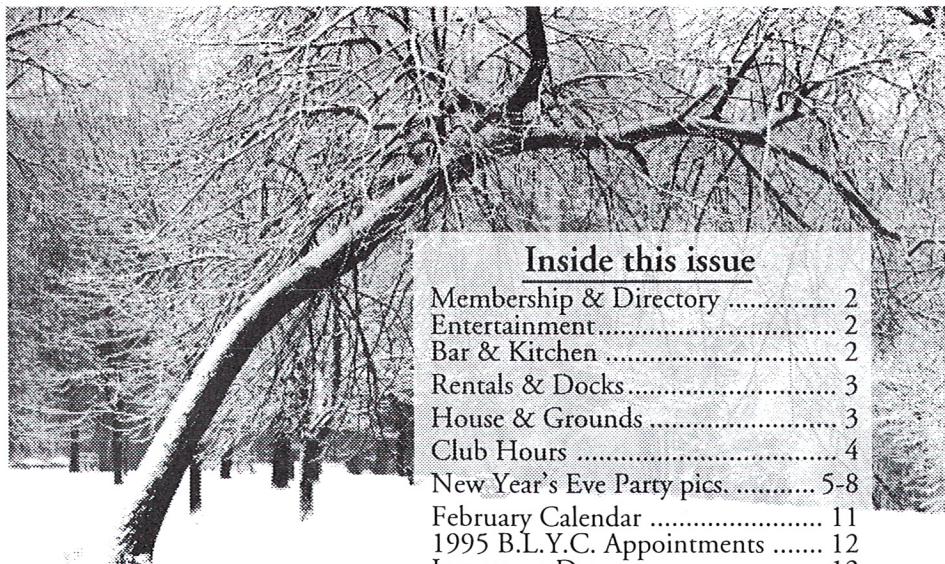
The use of the Guest Log seems to be catching on. A major portion of the

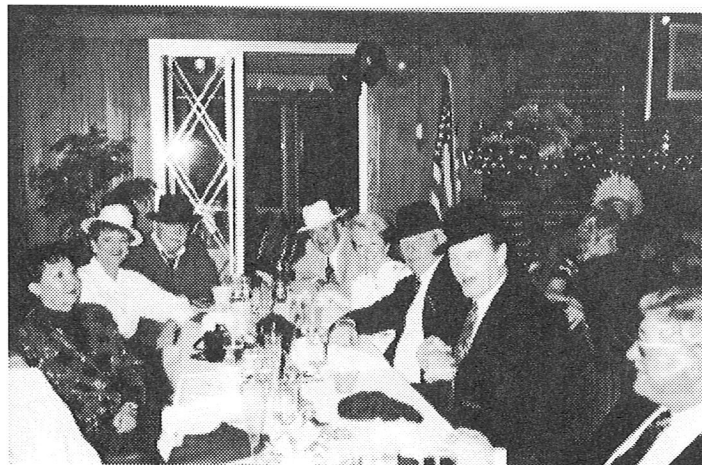

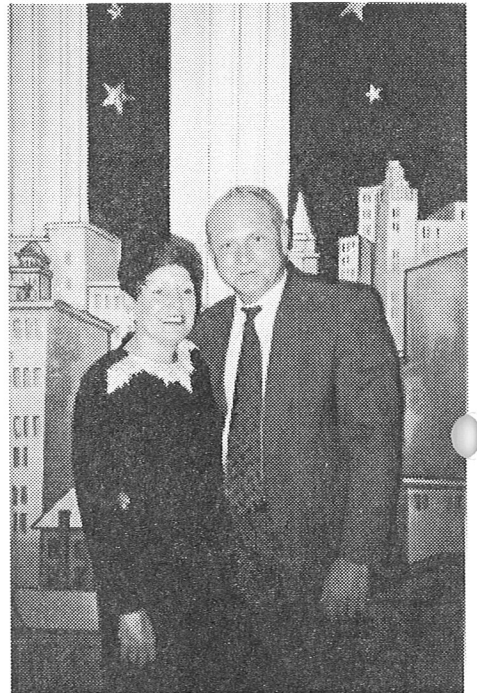
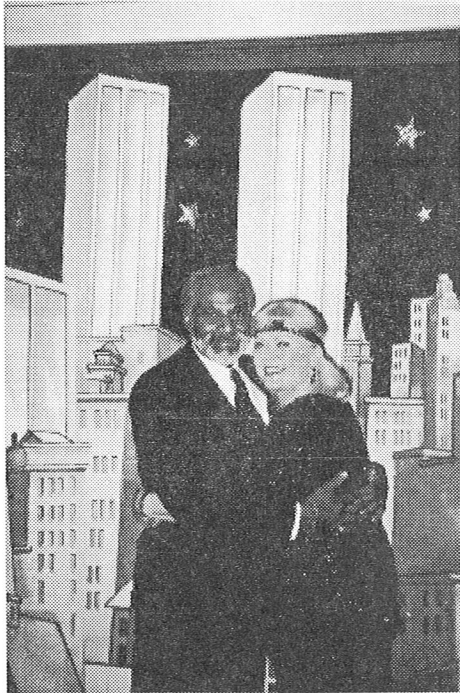
