

The happy group flew to the Bahamas on Friday, February 3rd and returned on Saturday the 11th. We boarded two sailing vessels in Nassau Harbor on Saturday, the 4th and spent 6 fun-filled days cruising the Exuma Islands. The sailing, the water and the snorkeling were great. We enjoyed some good seafood and camaraderie and the lirst and last nights of the trip provided an opportunity to explore the night life of Nassau. Although out-numbered

more than 2 to 1, the 6 wives in the group all reported having a wonderful time and thoroughly enjoyed the trip. Much of the credit for the success of the venture goes to Commodores Frank Foster III and Jim McBride for the fine job of planning and organizing the trip and to Carol Taylor for arranging the air transportation. Thanks, guys we all had a great winter break.

Just a short note about the importance to each member of insuring that the Club knows your current address status: The Club's membership roster is maintained by Andrea on the Club's computer. The roster is capable of holding as many as three addresses for each member - 1) the primary residence address, 2) the business address. and 3) the alternate residence address. In each member's record there is an indication of which of the three addresses is to be used for mailing correspondence (Logs, flyers, invoices) to the member. It is each member's responsibility to insure that the Club has current information for each of your addresses and that you have told us to which of your addresses we should send your correspondence. This is particularly important for the Snow-birds in our membership. When you depart the Buckeye Lake area for an extended stay in your winter residence, please let us know so that we may set the address indicator to your alternate residence. Likewise, when you return, please tell us to set your address indicator to the local address. This insures that you will get all of your Club correspondence in a timely fashion.

I have recently received comments from members concerning the higher costs being charged for the parties. i.e. \$12.50 per individual. Yes, it does seem high and yes. it is higher than was charged several years ago. Here is my response:

1) although there are those who would disagree. 1 think that the majority would agree that the food is better than it was in past years.

2) remember that for a party, the \$12.50 cost covers not only the dinner but also the tax and the tip and when provided, hors d'oeuvres and/or free drinks. Thus the entree on the normal menu for \$7.50 with hors d'oeuvres (\$1.50) and free punch (example \$1.00), plus tax and tip would come to \$12.10. As the cost of the entree goes up so does the total cost - an \$8.50 entree in this example equals a \$13.31 party cost. This does not mean that we always have hors d'oeuvres and free drinks or that we always serve an \$8.00 entree. We have tried to average the costs over the parties scheduled for the year.




