

s I write this article for the April Log, we are just finishing the greatest week of 'spring weather' in March that I can remember. I even saw some early bird water skiers and Sea-Dooers on the lake this week. It won't be long before boats will be in the water. The pool will open, and the Club goes to summer hours - and don't forget Spring Work Day (see Governor Oliver's article in this Log). This Work Day the Club will be having a porch sale where we will be offering used, no longer needed furniture, dishes, glassware, etc. at bargain prices. It will be sold on a firstcome, first-serve basis with proceeds going to the Ladies Auxiliary. Please bme out and help us prepare the Club for the Spring/Summer activities and visit the porch sale for some great bargains.

And speaking of the Ladies Auxiliary, the ladies are putting on an auction with all sorts of goodies on the 29th of April. This event is only scheduled once every two or three years and, as those of you who attended the last auction recall, it is a lot of fun. If you have an item to donate for the auction or want to help the ladies hold this event, contact Jackie Keiner or Ann Oliver. If you just want to join the fun, see this Log for the details and come out on the 29th to bid on some great stuff.

In the last six months, the Club has had nine applications for Perpetual Membership. This has prompted your Board to look carefully at the way the perpetual fee is structured and the trusts that these funds are invested in. As a result of this investigation, it is clear that, as currently implemented, perpetual memberships work to the disadvantage of the Club. As a result. the Board has taken action to suspend consideration of any further perpetual membership applications for the remainder of this Club year. In the meantime, two replacements have been appointed to the Perpetual Fund Committee - Rick Rueckel and Commodore Frank Foster Sr. - and these new committee members together with the remaining member -Commodore Conrad - have been charged with reviewing the fee structure and conditions of Perpetual membership as well as optimizing the investments of the perpetual trusts. The committee will report to the membership at the Annual Meeting in September.

Shortly after the March Board meeting, the Trustees approved the purchase of a new computer system for the Club. The system includes both additional computer hardware and new software specifically designed for operation of a private club such as ours. A new waitress station in the dining room will speed up order entry and reduce congestion at the bar cash register. A printer will relay the food orders directly to the kitchen, and the system will allow much better control of our charges and receivables. The system will permit automated billing of dues and monthly statements, improve handling of rentals such as docks and Eastport boat storage, allow tracking of reservations for parties and special events, and provide a payables system to assist in bar and kitchen purchases and payments. It will require that each member use a member number or code for all purchases. Our plan is to make the member code as painless as possible by using a portion of the members last name as the member code. You will receive noti-

As you pull into the parking lot you will see that several new items have been added to the area. The lights on the pillars have been donated by Jess Howard and Chuck Huffer, thank you gentlemen.

I have been working to clean up the parking lot. The fence line between the BLYC and the bank has been completely cleaned. We added two dump truck loads of gravel to the parking lot, and two more loads of topsoil to the low areas in the parking lot. The rope between the trees was installed several months ago and just recently I installed

a chain across the access to the grassy area to keep cars out because some areas are very wet.

Several sections of split rail fence have been installed to section off some parts of the lot we do not want people to drive on. Additional split rail fence will be installed at the rental house and the original driveway will no longer be accessible on a regular basis. More upgrades to the parking lot are yet to come so please try to make it to the Club for workday to give us a helping hand.

The docks sustained some damage over the winter but that should be repaired in the next several weeks so that boats can be put into their slips in a timely manner.

The board would like to install more docks at the Eastport area so that the members on the waiting list would get a slip sooner. However, I have had a discussion with Ed Frank the Buckeye Lake Park Supervisor and he tells me that there is going to be some construction on the north bank of the lake somewhere between Millersport and Picnic

Point. Due to the fact that this construction could affect us, we are puttin a hold on any new docks until we get all the information. What the construction will consist of is not yet known for certain, but there are public meetings being planned to discuss the options and Mr. Frank has suggested that everyone attend so that they can voice their opinions and be informed.

This is a good time to plug the Full Pool Breakfast sponsored every year by the Greater Buckeye Lake Chamber of Commerce, because the guest speaker this year is going to be a delegate from the ODNR who should be discussing among other things the potential construction. The Full Pool Breakfast will be at the Club on Friday April 28, 1995 at 7:00 a.m.. Tickets must be purchased in advance, for more information call Dick Wolf at 928-4566.


Jan Kaylor was thanked for her pretty shamrock table decorations which were given out as door prizes. Meeting adjourned at 8:25 p.m.
