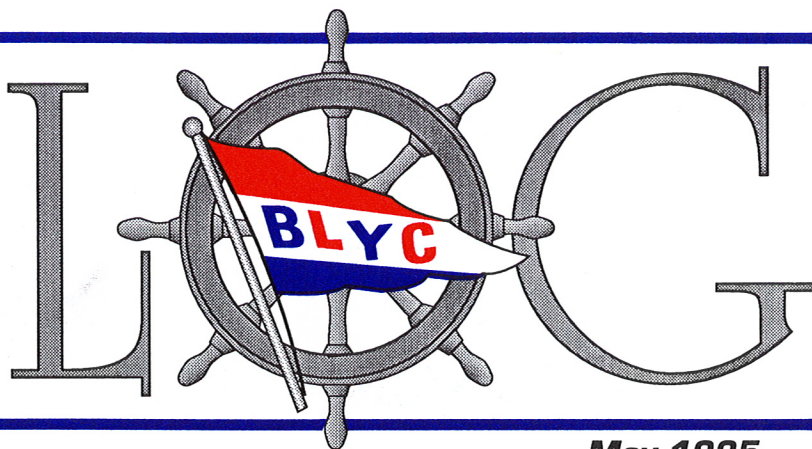

In addition, the committee has recommended a revision to the formula which is used to calculate the Perpetual Membership fee. The formula considers not only the prevailing dues structure for active members but also the current interest rate and the current inflation rate and appears to provide an equitable arrangement for both the Club and the prospective Perpetual Member. A proposed change to the Club's By-Laws addressing this subject is contained in this Log. If you have comment, please relay your feelings to a member of the Board as we plan to act on the proposed By-Law changes at the May Board meeting.

In addition to installing the Club's new computer system last month, we have also spruced up the Club's office with some new furnishings and equipment. A big 'THANKS' to Commodores Conrad and Wing for donating the carpet and drapes. It really makes a

difference. The addition of a new desk, storage cabinet and filing cabinet give the place a real office atmosphere and to cap it off, the office now sports a combination fax/copy machine! Yes, you can now fax the Club - the number is 929-2123 - and we can respond in kind. We finally have an office we can be proud of and which will greatly assist the staff in the performance of their duties.

Board To Consider Perpetual Membership Fee

The BLYC Constitution requires the Board to publish the substance of any change in the By-Laws before acting upon the proposed amendment. The Board has approved the following proposed amendment for such publication and may consider it at the next meeting.

The proposal is to change Article V, Section 2 (b) of the By-Laws as follows [underlining indicates added language, strike-through characters indicate deletion]:

(b) The fee for perpetual membership shall be ~~ten~~ one hundred times the sum of the current active dues and capital improvement charges divided by a percentage interest rate which is the difference between the current prime interest rate and the current inflation rate as shown by the current consumer price index unless set otherwise under Section 5 of this Article. A new member shall additionally pay the current initiation fee. Dues paid for the current year may be credited toward the perpetual membership fee only if the remainder of the fee is paid before May 1st of the current year.
