

As we approach the busy season at the Club, I feel the need, once again, to review the rules regarding guests at the Club. Unlimited guest privileges are accorded only to the family of a member, the female companion of an unmarried member or persons holding a valid Guest Card issued by the Board. Family is defined as mother, wife, sons under sixteen years of age and unmarried sisters and daughters of the member. Occasional guests are persons other than those defined above who visit the Club. They must be accompanied by their host member and if they live within

a fifty mile radius of the Club may only visit the Club a maximum of three times a year. These rules (as expressed in the By-Laws) are in existence for the benefit of the members who pay the bills through their dues and their participation in Club activities. It is not fair to the members when guests are allowed to abuse these rules and enjoy the benefits of membership without paying their fair share. The use of the 'Guest Registration' book helps the Club staff track occasional guest visitors and I encourage the members to continue to use it. With activities moving seasonally to the outside (pool, porch, etc.) it is harder to control abuse of the 'guest rules' and I encourage each of you to contact a Board Member when you become aware of guests taking unfair advantage of our Club.

Ron Harris and his wife Carol Ann, who live in Granville.




