

From what I hear, a great time was had by all and there are some very good young sailors among the group who will be representing the Club in future years at Put-in-Bay. A hearty thanks to Governor Walter Grubb and to his son Walter Jr. for a job well done.

And speaking of Put-in-Bay, Junior Bay Week held during the week of July 24 has not happened at the time I write this article, but the Club is again reprented by a three man Thistle crew headed by Walter Grubb Jr. Walter's crew did very well last year and we wish him and his crew the best of luck this year.

You may have noticed some new faces among the waitresses and bus persons serving you during the last couple of weeks. This is due both to increasing our staff for the summer and to replacing a long time employee, Kim, who decided to leave us for personal reasons. Kim's replacement is Debbie who started with us at the Pool Bar about a month ago. She has been replaced at the Pool Bar by Chris who formerly helped us in the dining room. The bussers now assisting in the dining room are Trenda and Shannon. Kim will continue to assist on special occasions and to fill-in when we need her. She will be missed as a regular. Please bear with us during this transition period.

I have recently become aware of several instances of alleged misuse of dock privileges by some of our members.

Namely, allowing another member without dock privileges to permanently park his boat in the dock for which the renting member has no further use. This practice, if being conducted, is grossly unfair to other members who typically wait for years for some of the more select docks. In an effort to put an end to any such misuse, we are asking all dock renters to provide the Club with a copy of the title for the boat for which their dock was rented. In this manner we can confirm that the boat parked in each dock does in fact belong to the renter. Sadly, I expect that providing a copy of the boat title at dock renting time will become a requirement for future rental of a BLYC dock. What ever happened to gentlemanly conduct, honor and fair play?

Finally, I have received several complaints recently regarding the quality of service in general and the recent party on Friday night at the Club. You may be surprised to know that we receive almost as many 'attaboys' for our service as we do criticisms. However, I must agree that service is slower now than it was several months ago. Service is always slower when we have larger crowds. We have a limited kitchen facility and by a necessity a fixed size kitchen crew. The members tend to socialize in the bar and then all descend on the dining room at the same time. Returning to a 'reservations only' on Friday nites might help to stagger the flow into the dining room. We are considering this approach. When we have two fully trained waitresses supported by a trained bussing crew, we can serve the food orders about as fast as the kitchen can produce them. So adding waitresses may not be the answer until we have a larger kitchen. Compound this with the fact that part of our dining room crew is in training and we have the current situation. Please bear with us as we come up to speed.

With regard to the Friday nite party of July 14th. It was a mistake that should not have happened. The party, for the graduating Junior Sailors, started out to be hot dogs around the pool in the afternoon for a dozen youngsters, then grew into a small banquet with parents and presentation of certificates. ince the last Log article, the kitchenbar operation has good news and bad news. I will first tell you the good news -

1995, indicates that the operation is now in the positive cash flow category. It is my belief that the report for the fiscal year ending August 31, 1995 should also be a good report.

Some other good news is that we have received many compliments regarding the quality of food and service, both verbal and written.

And now for the bad news - - We have received a couple written anonymous complaints, primarily about service - not the quality of the food. I had a discussion with Hans on July 21st regarding this correspondence. He and I are both concerned and pledge that we will continue to work on the problem. I have been told not to worry because you cannot satisfy everyone - but I'm going to try!

Friday night, the 14th of July, was a disaster and for that I apologize. The problem came about because of the conclusion of the Junior Sailing Program. Governor Walter Grubb thought it would be nice to have a dinner for the participants on the last day of class and give them their certificates. He anticipated sixteen students and he and Hans were surprised when parents and other family members joined the students, resulting in approximately 40 or 50 more persons than was anticipated. Walter feels bad about it, Hans feels bad about it, and I feel bad about it. We did the best we could under the circumstances. We believe we have learned and will endeavor not to let that ever happen again. The Junior Sailing Students and

their families appreciated the evening and the recognition.

One of the other problems is that the staff has no idea whether the main dining room will serve 40 or 140 on a given night, because very few people call in for reservations. Reservations would help and persons with reservations should get preferential treatment.

The negative letters we have received have been anonymous. I am requesting that if anyone has a concern to please call me personally at 928-3709 and I assure you it will not fall on deaf ears.
