

I want to thank the members, Hans, and the Staff for making this a successful year. Hans was appointed Manager last September and I thought it would be fitting to interview him at this time. I met with him on August 18th and asked him four questions.

Fred Wright - "After one year of being the B.L.Y.C. Manager, what would you like to say to the members?"

Hans Kamphowe - "I would like to take this opportunity to express my thanks and gratitude for the overwhelming support from the members in making this a successful year. Your kindness and understanding are very much appreciated by both Betty and myself."

Fred Wright - "What in particular could the Club do to help you improve the food and service?"

Hans Kamphowe - "As you probably know already, the planning and finalization of the bar and kitchen remodeling, (in particular the addition of a walk-in freezer and cooler), will greatly ease the handling of food and beverage service. Additional folding tables and chairs would help greatly in meeting our needs to accommodate everyone comfortably at special events."

Fred Wright - "There have been some comments relative to improving service. Would you care to comment on this?"

Hans Kamphowe - "Any service problems related to scheduled events on busy nights will certainly not be repeated. This first year has been and still

is a learning experience and again I appreciate your patience. The greatest problems to the staff and myself is the reluctance or forgetfulness by some members to make timely reservations. A table of four may not seem much to add on at short notice - but if twenty members decide to do this and they have, I might add, the situation becomes critical. I know the internal workings of a club or restaurant are of no or little concern to customers or members, but when we get only a once-a-week delivery from our major suppliers, and that order is placed on Wednesday and delivered on Thursday, there is little or no chance to purchase wisely for the additional needed supplies.

The second part of the difficult task - to serve a maximum number of members within a short time - deals with the considerable number of members congregating in the lounge and then deciding at one point to all sit down and eat together. With two servers, one cook, and myself, it is at times a difficult challenge to meet."

Fred Wright - "What is the final statement you would like to make to conclude your first year?"

Hans Kamphowe - "I think at this time it is also appropriate to thank my staff for their unselfish and untiring efforts to satisfy the wishes of the members and to perform their numerous duties to my satisfaction. Thank you." - Hans

Because of all the interest in boat slips and trailer and boat storage at Eastport I have had personal contact with many of you.

My only regret is that we can not accommodate more members with their choice of docks. If the State gets their sea wall project completed, the club can then move ahead with some dock expansion plans.

You may not see much difference in how the docks are being handled, but we are moving toward more strict enforcement of the rental and use of the docks we have. The first step was to update our knowledge of who belongs to what boat. The cooperation from the boat owners, by furnishing a copy of their boat title or registration, is going well. Those who have not complied please do so.

Next season look for enforcement of the dock usage rules. The Board of Trustees has volunteered to help the governor in charge to enforce the rules.

In a short time we will be thinking about putting our toys up for the winter. Space at our Eastport storage lot will be available. No! Eastport is not a free place to park your trailer. We are obligated to pay taxes on that area as well as maintenance so it is not a free ride. Space is assigned by the numbers located on the fence behind the spaces.

Stainless steel tags are being issued the renter of the space. The tag number is the space number. Please see to it that the tag gets put on the hitch area of your trailer or if no trailer put the tag

on the boat or whatever you are storing. Items with no tag will be subject to removal.

Speaking of removal, there are a few boats and trailers being stored that do not appear to have been used or for that matter even looked at for quite a while. Please consider having them removed. It will free up spaces and make the area look better.

I will end my report by thanking all of you for letting me serve as your governor. I will do my best to pass along what I learned this year so that the future will bring you better service.


