

t is a great honor and a significant personal challenge to be selected as your Commodore for the 1995-1996 season. I have the privilege to follow Marque Debenport who has been a truly great Commodore. I have learned a great deal from him and hope to follow through on the policies he initiated. Chief among these policies has been an effort to keep the interests of the memers as the Board's top priority.

As my first official act, I want to thank all of the men who ran for the Board of Governors in our recent election. It was a hard fought for contest. For those men who were not selected I certainly hope they will be willing to run again next year. We need their continuing support. Your new board is as follows:

The success of any year as well as the success of most human endeavor is based upon team work. It is my belief 'yat this is an excellent board which will work together well to solve the challenges ahead.

I have established two main goals: significant club renovations and acquisi-

tion of a minimum of 75 new members. For the past five years club members have been paying off the loan to purchase the parking lot. During that period of time, club maintenance was essentially put on hold. Areas of the foundation are significantly weak, the stairways leading to the front porch need attention and the front panel to the porch needs replaced.

Our kitchen facilities are antiquated and need modernized. That will improve service and the variety of food available. The bar needs enlarged so that we can serve more of our members. Finally, we need dry and cold storage adjoining the first floor kitchen facilities.

I will seek authority to correct the most critical maintenance tasks as soon as possible. Renovation to the bar and kitchen and construction of the food and beverage storage area will be addressed in the very near future.

Phase 1A and 1B which has been approved by the board will address the bar and kitchen issues. At the recent annual meeting the members voted overwhelmingly to adopt an assessment to pay for these maintenance concerns and renovations. The board will seriously consider this recommendation at its first meeting.

During the 1993-1994 year we lost approximately 45 members. Happily, we were able to regain that number through a tremendous new member recruiting effort by Commodore Dick Wolf. During the 1994-1995 year we lost a similar number of members. However,

we were not as successful in gaining new members.

If we lose the same number of members this year, we will need to recruit an additional 65 members simply to break even. Therefore, I intend to initiate a serious recruiting effort. That would include involving our new members in club activities and reaching out to recruit new prospective member candidates. If you have a prospective member, please contact our new Membership Governor, John Geiger or me.

I look forward to serving you through this coming year. If you have any problems or concerns with any club activities, please contact me at your earliest convenience.
