

am extremely pleased to announce that our much anticipated Club renovation project is about to begin. Our contractor is scheduled to begin construction of the dry storage facility, cold room and freezer in early December. The three areas will adjoin one another and be placed at first floor level on the north side of the club. The increased storage space will enhance food buying opportunities and provide greater menu variety. We will no longer have to rely on refrigerated trucks for beverage storage for big summer events.

The outside of the food and beverage storage rooms will be covered with siding to coordinate with the siding on the rest of the club. Commodore Dave Cox has graciously donated a large ship's wheel to decorate the wall facing the north bank.

The plans also call for a complete renovation of the kitchen and bar. We will be shopping for new or nearly new appliances to replace those that we have now. The bar will be expanded to add an additional seven seats.

The project has been financed by Tiney McComb of Heartland Bank and we thank him for that. The entire project should be completed by the first part of February.

Annual dues statements will be mailed in the very near future. Your board would appreciate it if you would return payment as soon as possible to avoid any possible income shortage. Statements sent to dock renters will include a note describing two new requirements that I want to explain. First, we are requiring that unless good cause can be shown, to retain a boat dock you must have your boat in it. The goal quite simply is to have docks in the hands of members who come to the club and use their boats.

Further, we are asking that each prospective dock renter provide evidence of his entitlement to the boat. It is not fair for a member to avoid the dock waiting list by "buying" an interest in a boat belonging to someone who already has a dock. Governor Manifold with the great assistance of Commodore McBride are ready to administer these two new requirements. Please contact either Dick, Jim or me if you have any questions or problems.




license fee charged by the state in addition to the fee.

- 3. No dock will be assigned a dock license until a copy of the boat registration is on file at the club.

It's time to start thinking about putting the finishing touches on our main entrance off 79. Any donations either for money or ideas would be sincerely appreciated.

Kathy announced that Stacy Foster would not be able to chair the Las Vegas Nite and that Phyllis Flynn and Martha Maite would replace her.


Kathy asked us to think about purchasing tables and chairs for special events (concerts, etc.) and any other ways we can help further the Club.
