REVIEW OF RULES OF CLUB USAGE

s we head into the summer season it is appropriate to review several of the more important rules of the usage of club facilities. These rules have been developed to make the visits of members and guests to the Yacht Club as enjoyable as possible.

- 1. Any food or beverage items which are to be consumed on the island must be purchased from BLYC. Bylaws (B) Art. III. Sec. 1 (c) and Art. XI Rule 7.
- 2. The family of a Member in good standing, including only his mother, wife, sons under 16 years of age and unmarried sisters and daughters, and the unmarried recognized regular woman companion of an unmarried member in good standing, will be entitled at all times to guest privileges.

Persons other than those explicitly stated above will, as occasional guests of a Member in good standing, be entitled occasionally to Guest Privileges, but no person residing within a radius of fifty miles from the Club Premises, and who is eligible to membership in the Club, shall be a guest on Club premises more than three times in any one year. B. Art. VI Sec. 1 (a), (b).

- 3. Children under 12 must wear life jackets when on Club property outside of the Club house except that a child will be excused from this rule if a parent requests in writing that the child be excused and states in writing that such parent assumes all liability and all risk for such child and agrees to hold the Club harmless for injury to such child. B. Art. XI Rule 23.
- 4. All persons using the swimming pool will be expected to conduct themselves according to the posted pool rules.
- 5. A boat slip is rented to the person who has title of the boat using the slip. B. Art. XI Rule 24 Sec. 5 (a).
 - 6. Transfer or sale of a boat does

not include transfer of slip rights. B. Art. XI Rule 24 Sec. 5 (b).

- 7. New members are eligible to complete a dock application after election to membership. B. Art. XI Rule 24 Sec. 6 (a).
- 8. Members must have their boats in their assigned docks by June I, of each year or be subject to loss of the dock. B. Art. XI Rule 24 Sec. 7 (c).

There are, of course many other important rules. To avoid problems the best policy is to carefully read the Constitution and Bylaws. If you do not currently have a copy please contact Governor Geiger or myself.

By-Laws Amendment

he Board of Governors has approved for publication, as per Article X of the Constitution, the following Amendment to the By-Laws of the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club:

Proposed for Amendment, By-Laws Article I. Section 9. (a) and (b) - Regarding ASSOCIATE MEMBERS

Proposed changes noted by (to be changed - <u>underlined</u>, changed to - **bold/italics**

I.9.(a) "ASSOCIATE MEMBERS may be of any place of residence, each

must be at least twenty-one years of age and less than thirty-one (change to thirty-five) years of age. Each associate member is entitled to the same privileges as those of an active member excepting Electoral Privileges."

I.9.(b) "Associate Members shall be required to pay ten percent of the initiation fee upon application for membership and at least ten percent of the initiation fee each year until such fee is fully paid; however, that initiation

fee must be fully paid by the member's <u>thirty-first</u> (change to *thirty-fifth*) birthday."

Recommendation presented (herein, May 1996 B.L.Y.C. Log) by John Geiger, Membership Governor for consideration and approval by the Board of Governors at least one week after publication, as per Article X of the Constitution.







