

n previous years I have had complaints that members did not know what was going on at the Club and at what

times. It was this that precipitated the design and issuance of a calendar for this fiscal year, showing all the events and times of events available to members, including open dining. The calendar was designed with plenty of open space so that it could be used as a planning calendar in your home. It has proven to be successful.

The entertainment program for the past eight months has gone well. Several new things were added this year. The Family Christmas Dinners, which is an opportunity for members to bring their families to a festive Christmas dinner at the Club with entertainment and a Santa Claus with gifts for children under 12. This was fairly successful and will probably be considered again for this coming Christmas season. The Mardi Gras was not as successful as previous years and may be dropped next year. The Mystery theatre, with approximately 180 attending, was a huge success. We tried a Friday Night Live, which consists of a piano player and members with musical instruments and group singing once a quarter. The members appeared to enjoy these.

The entertainment for the next four months has been planned and committed, starting with the Springenfest and Commodores' Ball in May; Western party with the Raizin Cain Band and Commodores' Steak Fry with well-known central Ohio steel drum player, Deighton Charlemagne, in June; Mexican Night in July; Luau in August; and San Francisco, California in September. This will conclude our World Cruise

theme this year.

There will be three special events where the cost of the entertainment will not come out of the entertainment budget. All the other costs for entertainment come from the entertainment budget established from your dues. These special events will have to be selfsupporting and we hope with a positive cash flow. They are namely - Rock and Roll Concert - June 28th, with the Mojo Men (This is a change from Saturday the 29th to Friday the 28th); the Crystal Ballroom Party on July 27th with the 16-piece Rick Brunetto Band; and the Jazz Festival on August 24th, with the Iim Masters Jazz Band. These three events will not be open to the public, but will be open only to members and their guests. Please ask friends, relatives, and neighbors and support these three events.

In conclusion, the big event of the summer will be the gala weekend celebration for the 90th anniversary of the founding of the Club. It will start on Friday night, July 26th, with a regular Friday night open dining, concluding with a guitar/singing duo concert at poolside. At this time we are working on an in-the-water synchronized swimming show, but it has not yet been committed.

The 90th anniversary celebration will continue with a brunch on Saturday. A 1 o'clock sailboat race and an afternoon of DJ music by Commodore John Sproat from 3:00 to 6:00. Saturday concludes with a dinner and the Crystal Ballroom Dance under the stars.

The celebration will continue on Sunday with a 9:00 to 1:00 brunch and conclude with a 2:00 to 4:00 concert by the Brass Band of Columbus, lead by Dr. Paul Droste. It should be a fantastic 90th anniversary celebration weekend. We ask you to set aside this weekend and support all the events.
