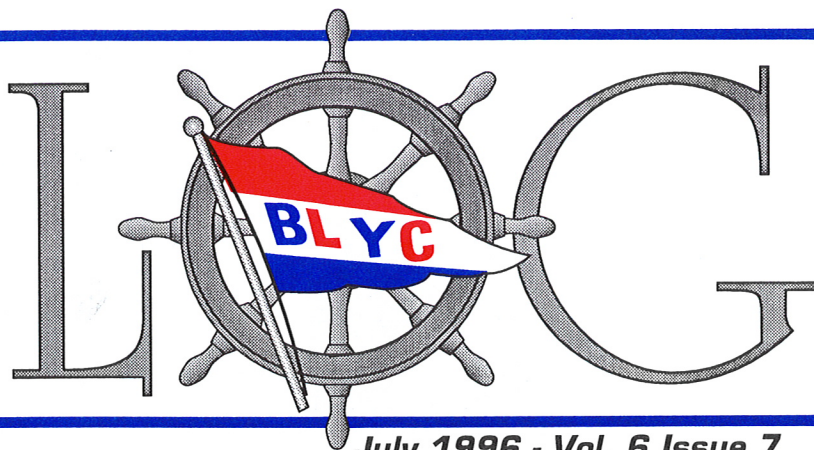


# Buckeye Lake Yacht Club

On April 24, 1906, forty yachtsmen met in Columbus to form what was to become the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. On Sunday, May 6, 1906, on Orchard Island the founding members selected our name and adopted the BLYC Constitution. The stated objectives of the Club were, "the promotion and elevation of yachting, the enhancement of aquatic sports, the cultivation of sociability among its members and to help in every way possible toward improvement of Buckeye Lake for boating purposes." Referring to these objectives, Kyle Armstrong in his *Story of Buckeye Lake Yacht Club* stated "while especially appropriate at that time, all four of such points still appear inseparably related and essential to the Club's continued

welfare and progress."

This month we are honored to celebrate the 90th Anniversary of our Club. From my experience as first, Governor and now, Commodore, it is evident that the success of the Club is based on continued member involvement. We have a beautiful Clubhouse which we have worked hard to improve in recent months, however the true value of the Club results from members working together to achieve common goals, so long as this cooperation continues, the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club will enjoy many more decades of growth.

## "Tween The Trees" Cruise

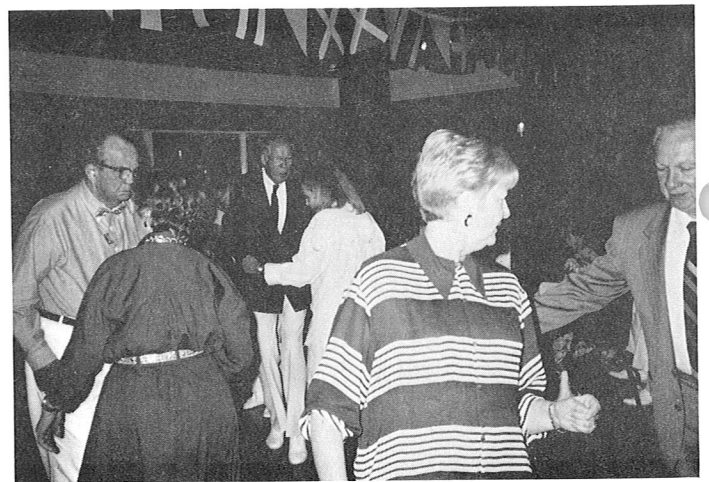
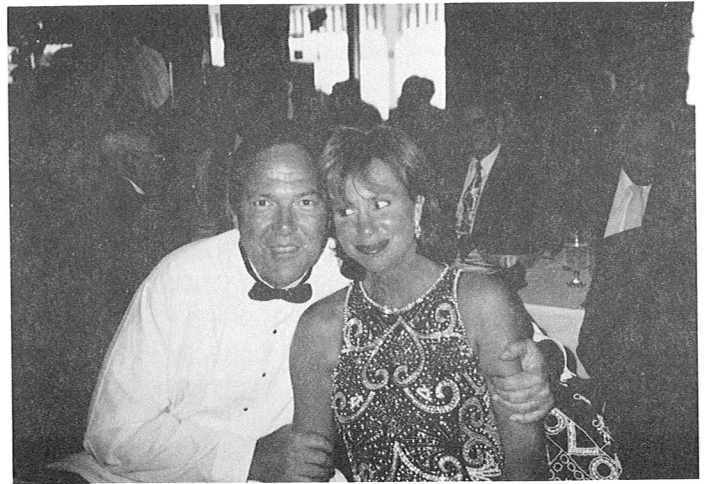
