


Reservations! Wednesday and Friday open dining reservation can be made on 15-minute intervals (e.g., 6:45, 7:00, 7:15, 7:30, 7:45 etc.). We are usually heavily booked for 7:00 and 7:30. Since many reservations are made by recorder,

we cannot always let you know of possible delays at 7:00 and 7:30 due to the number of requests for those times. If you normally choose 7:00 or 7:30, consider making reservations for 6:45, 7:15 or 7:45. Our capacity to serve you is not so much based upon the number of tables available, but rather, the number of orders that go to the kitchen at a particular time.

To say the least, storage at the Eastport Facility was not uneventful.





she would further check into this matter. As editor, I assure you that all Logs are mailed out the same day. Columbus residents seem to get their Logs as much as a week or more ahead of the Buckeye Lake Area residents. Obviously, once the Logs are in the postal system, I have no control over when they are delivered to you from your postal stations; however, note that I am concerned about your concerns. It was suggested to me that if you are having a problem receiving your Log that you contact your specific station. Hopefully, you can come to some resolution.

Remember, this is your information source. I am still interested in items of interest for publication in upcoming Logs. It's simple, just drop them in my box at the Club by the 15th of the month.


















## **Editor's Spotlight**

Margene and Chris Lambrecht short story. Chris J. Lambrecht joined BLYC in 1922 as a Junior member and became a Senior member in 1924. He stated that in those days you had to prove yourself—be a member for 10 years, and either serve on, or as a chairman of a committee before you could become a Governor.

Chris took over as Commodore on September 25, 1938. Under his administration many duties were performed. The building committee that had existed for 33 years was dissolved, the Club was incorporated, and they produced facilities for the Club that were second to none. They set up a board of trustees and suggested formation of the Chamber of Commerce. He recalls a meeting held to oust a Communist. The club had little money; therefore, much of the work was done by the members. In a period of four months, they had eight dances as fund raisers. There were more sail and motor boats then than we have now. Chris calls to mind some of the events of that day, which were regular races, bang and go back races for motor boaters, and treasure hunts for both sail and motor boats. They also held Wednesday and Saturday evening moonlight events for sail boats. Five bowling teams represented the club in the ILYA and won 1st and 2nd place prizes. Other events included clam bakes, shore dinners and fish fry parties, and a stag frolic.

Chris' vivid memory recounts the European War and many of the members joining up. He too was sent overseas to duty in Africa, Sicily and the E.

T. O. He shared that coming back from active duty he still loved and continued to work at the BLYC. Chris was honored this past July at our 90th Anniversary Gala Celebration as the member holding the longest membership, that being 72 years. To date, Chris remains a faithful, loyal, dedicated, constant, supporting and inspiring working member of our club. His lovely wife, Margene, is an active member of the Ladies Auxiliary and too has served over the years in various capacities.


