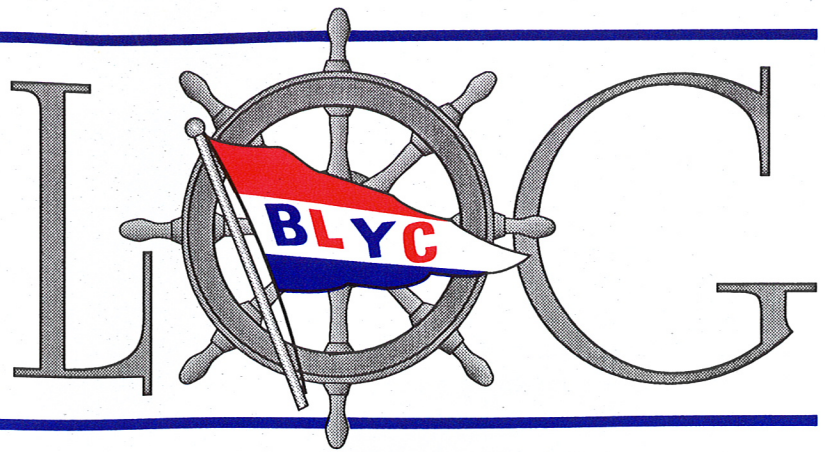

I want to thank everyone who called for Wednesday and Friday dining room reservations at "off the hour and one-half hour" (e.g. 6:45-7:15-7:45) time intervals this past month. Our peak times for dining are at 7:00 and 7:30. We welcome reservations at these peak times; however, by "spreading out" reservation times (using quarter hour intervals) we gain flexibility by coordinating orders more efficiently through the kitchen, thus avoiding delays both in seating, and in order-to-serve time.

My apologies to anyone who has not been greeted within a reasonable amount of time, by myself or staff, after arriving at the Club for a dining room reservation. I am assuming personal responsibility for this element of our dining room service plan. If your name is on our reservation list, I will look for you, and coordinate your seating and service.

Reservation times should reflect the specific time you want to "dine." If you wish to have cocktails in the bar prior to dining, please allow for this time when requesting a specific dining time.

If you want to spend time after dining with your group, please consider the fireplace room (or bar area). This will help us turn tables more rapidly during peak service hours on Wednesdays and Fridays. An increased emphasis will be placed on beverage service at tables in the fireplace room. In addition to serving as your host for dining room reservation seating, I will be assisting our wait and bar staff by taking beverage orders and providing table service in the fireplace room. If we get busy, or at slow times when it is not feasible to provide separate bar staff this winter, I am personally looking forward to serving your beverage-bar needs.

I want to join the Board, Trustees, members and staff in wishing Nancy well in her retirement. Just in the few

months that I have served as your manager, I have come to appreciate Nancy's knowledge and expertise more than anyone (other than possibly a past manager) could understand. Thank you Nancy for making my first few months on the job a lot easier than it would have been without your contribution and experience.
