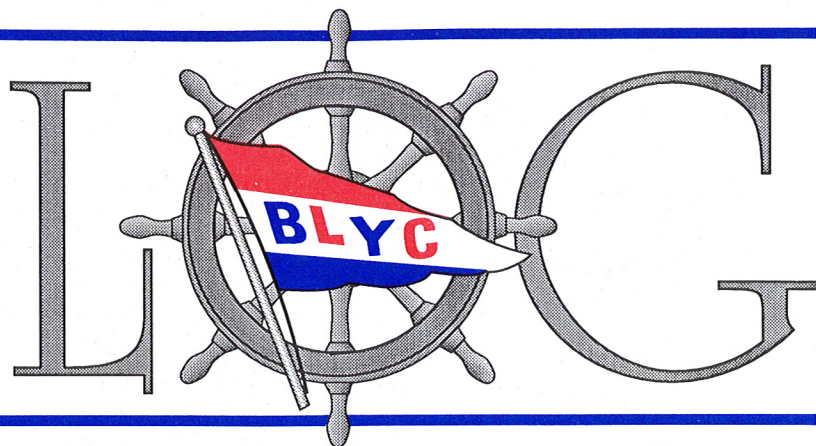

Governor Wayne Lee is to be complimented on the fine job he is doing with the Log and his efforts to get it in your hands by the first of each month and .

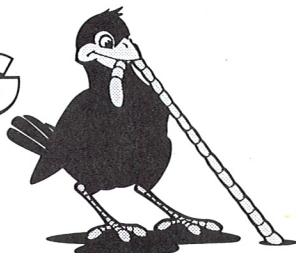

Thanks for the cards and visits during my time away from the Club.



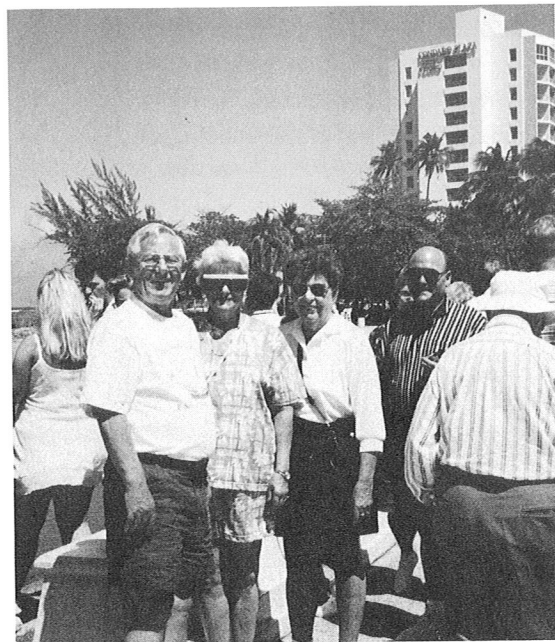
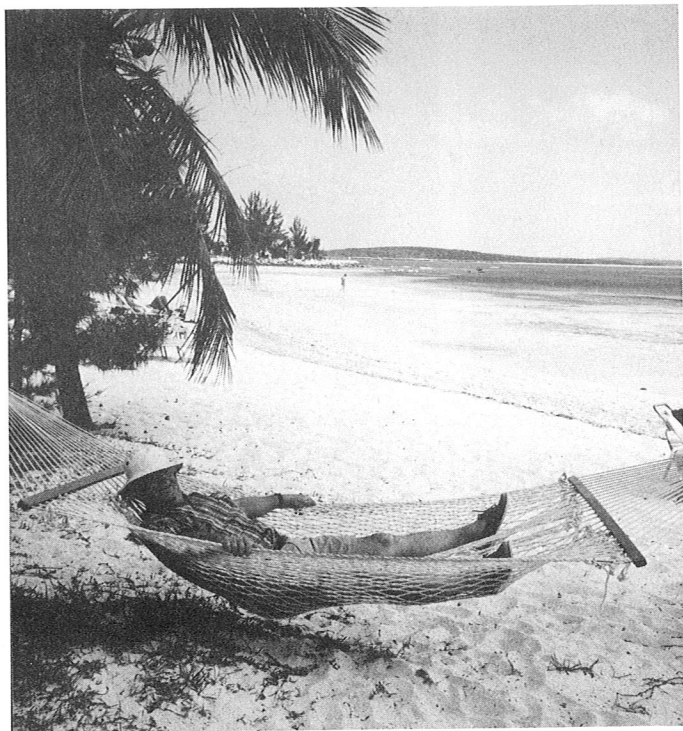

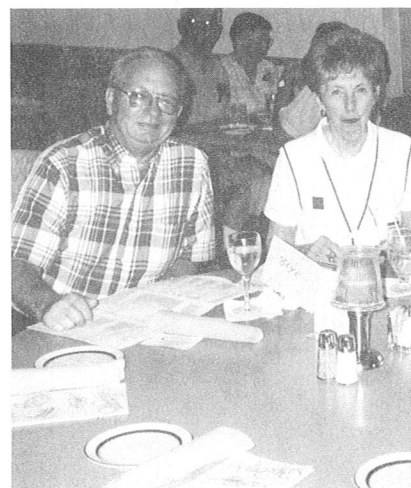
## Cruise Highlights From the Editors Pen;
