



Remember, continued success of your Club depends on our membership. Please—if you have a prospective new member, bring them to our Rush Party or have them contact me at the Club or at 928-6116.




main purpose is to encourage members to use the dining room more on our slow days—mainly Saturday and Sunday.

#### Cruise Highlights From the Editors Pen;






