


Personal Water Craft Safety

- 1. Wear Your Life Jacket Or PFD An approved PFD is required by law for each person on board. Since there is no room to store it, you must wear it. Remember, It Won't Work If You Don't Wear It.
- 2. **Boating And Booze Don't Mix** Alcohol impairs your ability to make good quick decisions. This is critical when operating a fast and maneuverable personal water craft.
- 3. **Know Your Craft** Study the manufacturer's manual and practice handling of your craft under experienced supervision and in open water well away from other boaters.
- 4. **Take A Boating Safety Course** Learn the common boating rules, regulations and safe practices.
- 5. **Lookout—Ride Defensively** Collisions with other boats or stationary objects like rafts or docks are the number one cause of personal watercraft injuries.

- 6. Watch The Weather Check the weather forecast before starting out. Be alert for the wave, wind, cloud changes that signal the approach of bad weather.
- 7. **Be Prepared For Cold Weather** Cold water robs body heat 25 times faster than air of the same temperature. If you fall off your craft into cold water, immediately reboard.
- 8. Know The Area Do not assume the water is clear of obstructions. Rocks, shoals, sand bars, submerged pilings can seriously damage the craft or those on board. Check marine charts and stay in marked channels.
- 9. Carry Safety Equipment Besides approved PFDs and a sound-signaling device (like a whistle), it is prudent to carry a tow rope and, when operating on a large body of water, some small type-B flares in a watertight container.
- 10. **Don't Ride At Night** Most personal watercraft are not made with the lights required by law for night riding.

taking repairs to the Watkins Island boat docks which should be completed by the end the end of April. The posts supporting the covered docks at the Island are particularly precarious looking and in serious need of additional support. A number of the docking posts on the west wall and on the west side of the south wall were broken by the ice this winter. The replacement posts are being attached in a manner that will prevent the ice from reaching them in the future.

The hoist at Eastport appears to be functioning properly and is ready for use in launching boats. The control mechanism is covered with plastic to protect the switch contacts and the plastic wrap should not be removed by lose members utilizing the hoist. The water well at Eastport will again be functional in the near future.

The club parking lot managed to accumulate some additional pot holes

through the winter and has been repaired. Hopefully, these repairs will carry us through the next several months. Unfortunately, nothing short of paving the lot will eliminate the need to make frequent repairs to the parking lot, but for the time being we are in good shape.

With regard to future projects, the two-story rental house next to the parking lot entry drive is in need of painting. The storage garages in the Club parking area are also in dire need of an appearance upgrade. The cement block requires powerwashing and the doors need painting. I hope to get both of these projects taken care of in the next few months.

NATIONAL SAFE BOATING WEEK - MAY 17-23, 1997

"Life Jackets: They Won't Work if You Don't Wear Them!"

In 1993, 80 percent of the people who died in boating accidents on the waters of the United States died from drowning.

Based on those cases with good data (somebody survived to tell the story) 85 percent of those people probably would be alive if they were wearing a proper PFD (personal flotation device).

Modern technology has led to the development of PFDs which are comfortable to wear, and are reasonably "stylish."

Who should wear their PFDs all the time?...Everyone, but especially:

- Children under 12
- Hunters and fishermen, since they may be out alone and on the water when water temperature are cold enough to greatly reduce survival time.
- Canoers, kayakers and users of personal watercraft, since these craft can easily capsize or flip.




