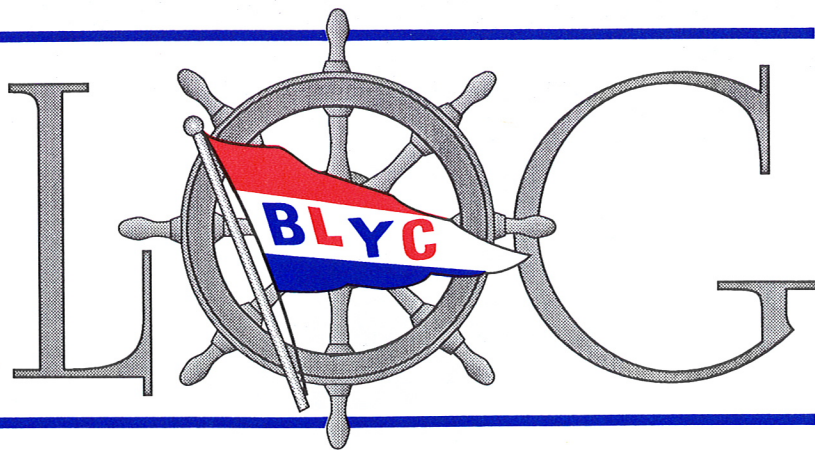
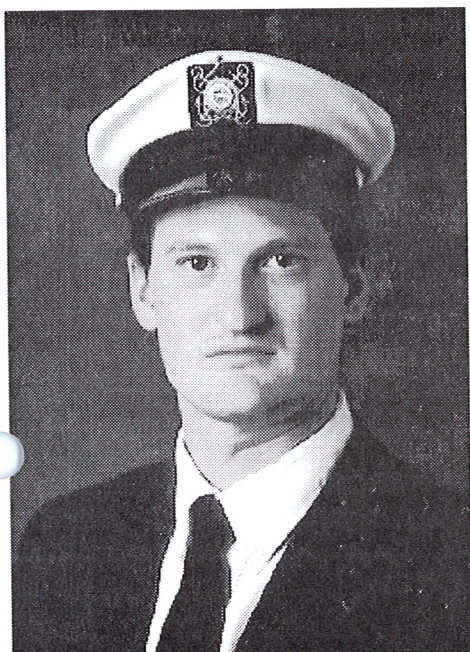

Welcome aboard !! We are sailing off into a new year of Off-Island Maintenance. Fall Work dDay is October 19, 1997, and we have a full days schedule.

We will install the bubblers to protect the docks from ice damage and replace any lights that are not functioning.

The vines and vegetation that have grown up behind the garages will be removed and the spouting will be repaired and installed.

At Eastport, the weeds and other growth will be removed from the fence lines, the bank and docks.

Short-term projects include: painting or siding of the two story rental, trimming trees west of the ranch house, roof repair of the garages, security lighting at the south end of the covered docks and repairing some walkways and the boat slips.

The long-term project is the expansion of docks, especially at East Port. A committee has been formed to study the

area where the old Pier Ballroom once stood. The committee includes John Sproat, Chairman, Mark Yerke, Dock Rentals and yours truly.

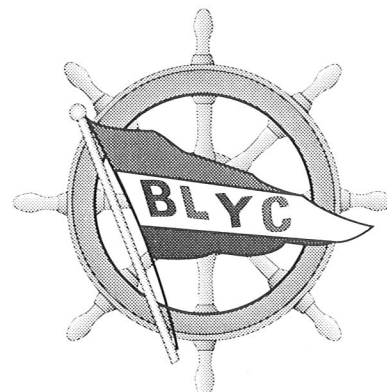
I am excited to be on the Board and look forward to serving you as Docks and Rentals Governor.
