



ur sails may not be full this time of year; however, some projects have been completed and others are progressing.

Work day was successful with the off-island projects. I want to thank John Geiger, who spent the day with me installing the bubblers at the docks around the Club House, Area Eight, and East Port.

We are purchasing two bucket bubblers and one post bubbler to replace some that are no longer functional. I have contacted Dave Levacy and he has ordered the new bubblers at his marina in Millersport.

I have been clearing the vines along the fence and the back of the garages by the bank. The back of the garages will be painted this spring.

I have received estimates and approval to trim the trees and remove all dead wood in them around the rental houses and the parking lot. This project should be completed by the end of December.

The pump house has been winterized, thanks to Mac Wood. New hoist straps will be ordered, The broken flood light at the entrance has been replaced after installing a new socket.

Other projects will include estimates for siding of the two-story house, roof repair, and replacement at the docks and garages.
