BLYC Captains To Boat

Third Leg of Ohio River
he 1998 Homer Tussing Memorial will complete the third of five legs of Ohio River boating which has attracted a growing number of BLYC captains and their crews each year. Stretching from mile marker 0 at the confluence of the Allegheny and Monongahela rivers in the shadow of Pittsburgh's Three Rivers Stadium to the Indiana state line west of Cincinnati. The 5 year undertaking is open to all BLYC members, whether as captain, crew or passenger.

This year's leg, scheduled for July 31st through August 2nd, will take the fleet from Toronto, Ohio to Marietta, Ohio and return—a distance of 226 miles—in 3 days. All boats will pass through a total of 6 locks. Crews will overnight in the historic Wells Inn in

Sistersville, WV; Saturday night dinner will be in Marietta's Levee House on the banks of the beautiful Ohio.

Crews who complete any three legs of the 5-year/5-leg journey will receive a handsome captain's cap which identifies the owner as a true river pilot.

If you even think you might be interested in making the trip, fill out the form that will be mailed to you and leave it with Linda or Andrea at the Club. Passengers will be assigned boats as space permits. For further information, call Jerry Boundy at 224-2115 or Ken Keller at 846-8761.






