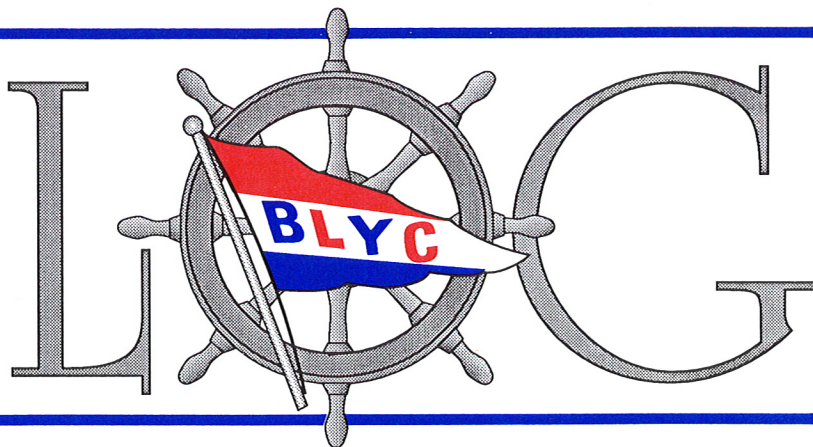
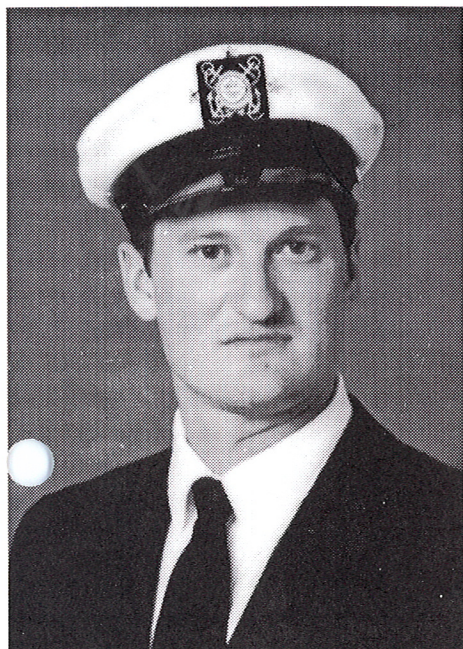

Projects that have been completed, beginning in October and on April work day, included bubblers being installed and removed. The vines on the garages and some at East Port were removed. Trees were trimmed in the parking lot, west of the ranch-style rental and next to the pool. A new roof was installed on the covered docks. The parking lot was graded and new gravel was laid. New wood and posts are being replaced where needed at the docks. New hoist straps were purchased and placed in the pump house this season. The two-story rental had some broken windows replaced and the sump pump repaired. Also, new vinyl siding will be installed later this spring. The security light south of the covered docks has been relocated. Some light sockets have been replaced at the docks and at the entrance to the parking lot. Also, light bulbs are replaced as needed. A new dishwasher was installed at the ranch-style house.

Projects to be completed include a new rope fence in the parking lot, repair of the gate at Area 8, painting at the rear of the garages, painting of the metal posts at the docks, and hopefully, a new roof for the garages.

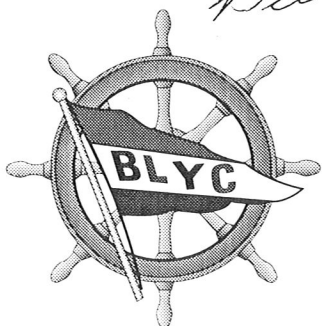
House & Grounds

Cassidy Ford

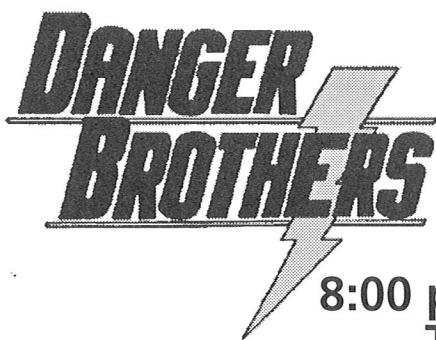
Many of you will recognize Cassidy's smiling face. Always hard working and perky, she has been at the Yacht Club for two years.

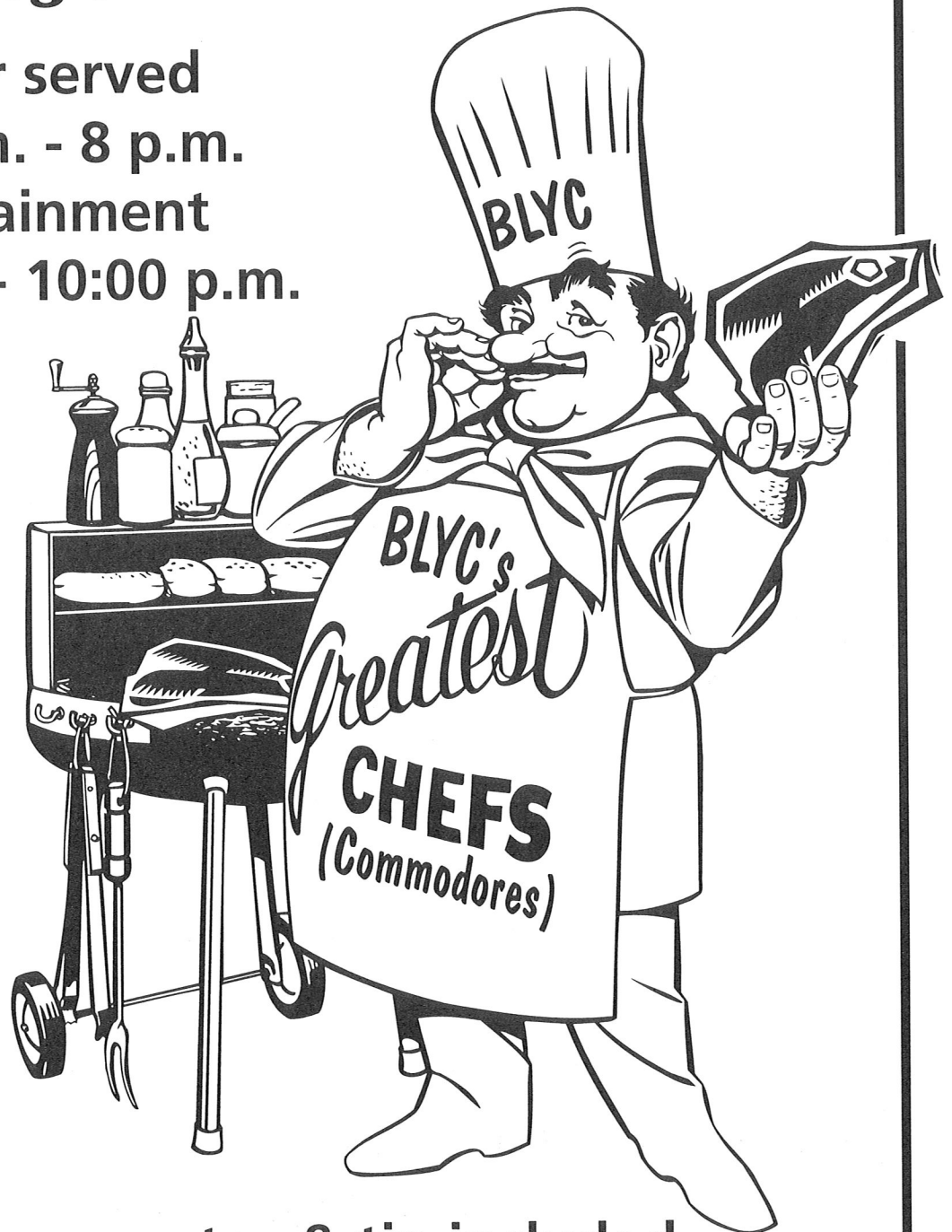

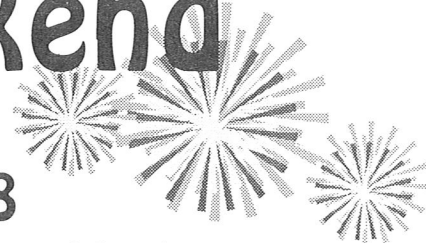
