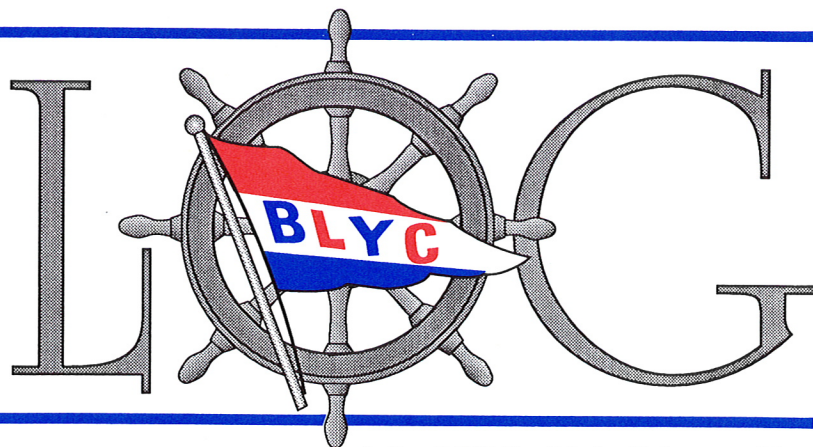
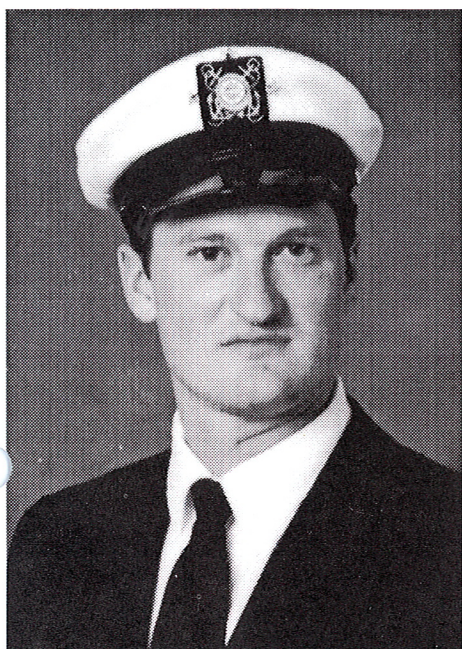

Four Freshman tickets are now available for the show on July 25. See Linda at the Club. Remember, seating is limited and last year we sold out completely.

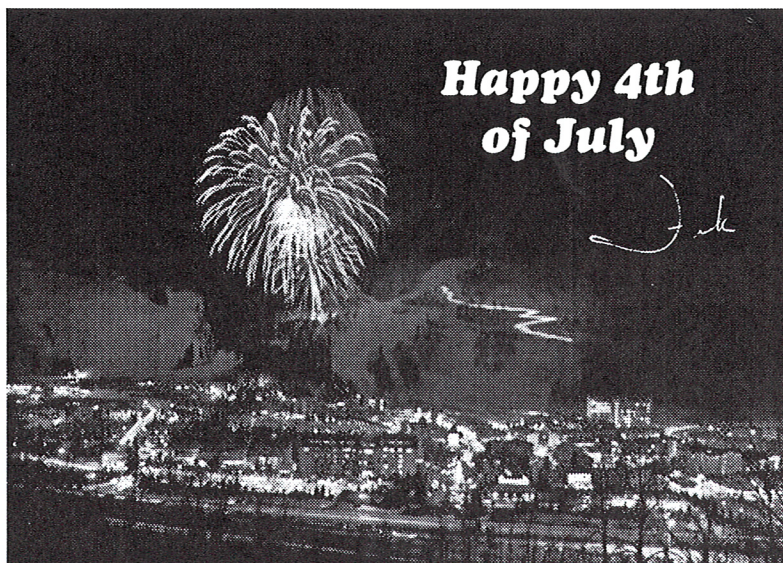
The Golf Outing on July 19 is always a fun event. A big thanks to Don Best for his past years of organization and for what I am certain will be another great event to mark on your calendar.

Rentals & Docks

The summer boating season

is now upon us and members with Club docks should now have

their boats in the water. If you are not planning to use your Club dock this summer, please let me know so that I can temporarily assign it to a member who needs one.

I have made more guest docks available at the Club. This should allow the Club to be more accessible for boaters who do not rent Club docks. Guest docking is available in three areas: 1) directly in front of the club - 4 docks, 2) directly behind the club in the back basin against the tow path - 5 docks, 3) and along the west side of Area 8 (this is the long pier that extends from the Sayre Brothers store) - 5 spaces. Each guest dock is identified by a blue metal sign which reads "BLYC Guest".

The Eastport Storage facility is now easier to use. Name signs have been attached to the fence for each member's storage space. This should make it easier for members to identify their space and prevent others from unknowingly parking there.

Unfortunately, there are several unidentifiable trailers that are parked in unassigned spaces at Eastport Storage. I warned that the Club would take action on these occurrences in my December 1997 log article. If one of these trailers is yours, you will want to contact me

before you try to use it again so that you are not inconvenienced.

"I think I just happened to jump faster. It wasn't like they were sitting around not knowing what to do," said Miller, 47, a commercial photographer.

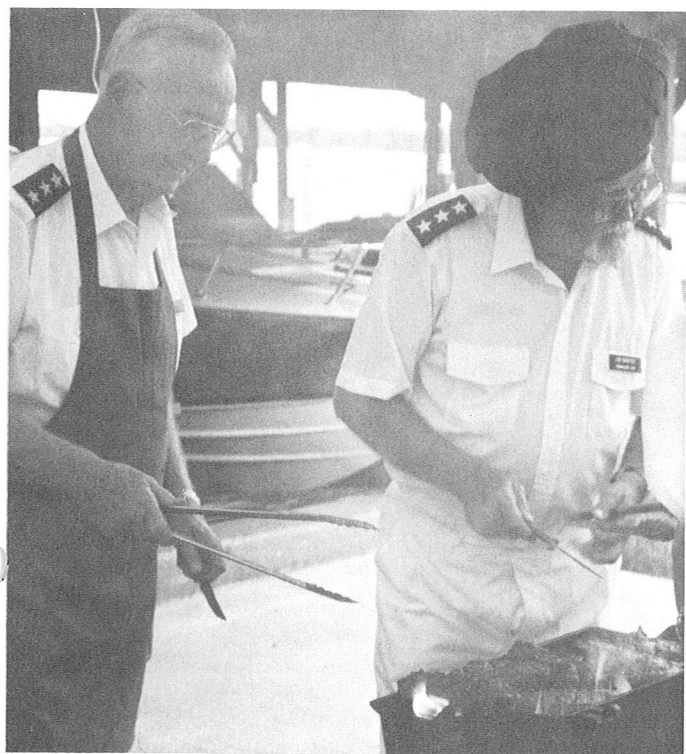
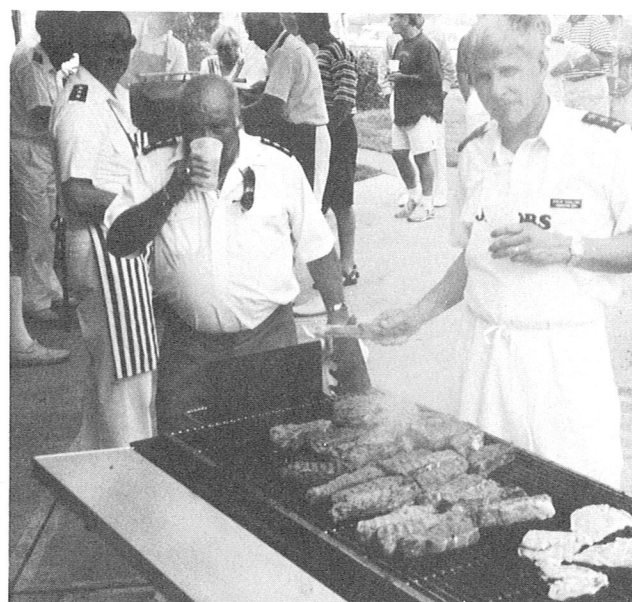

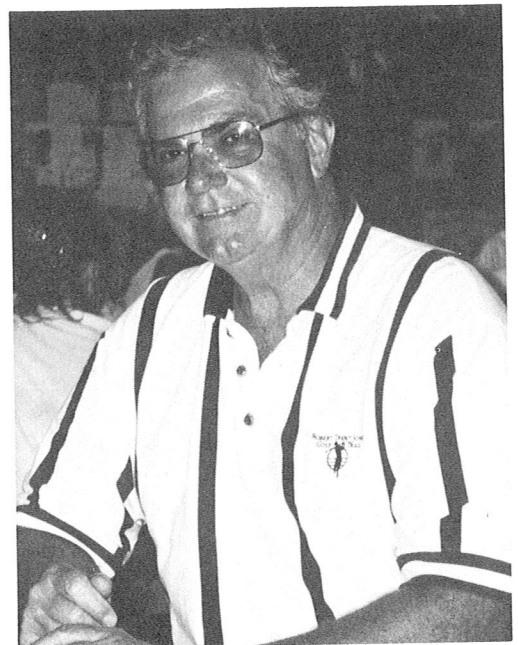
But Miller received no such recognition. As he returned to pick up his camera and equipment, he was confronted by an usher.

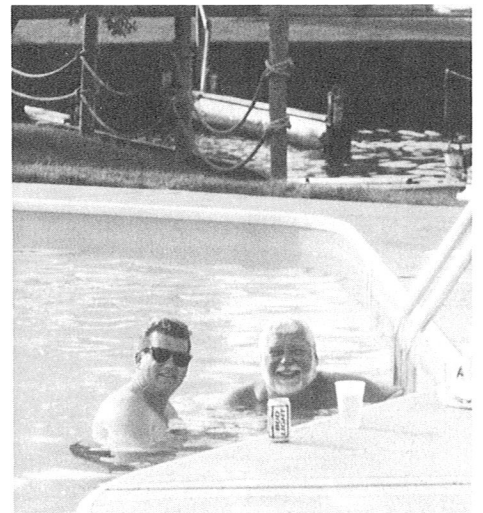
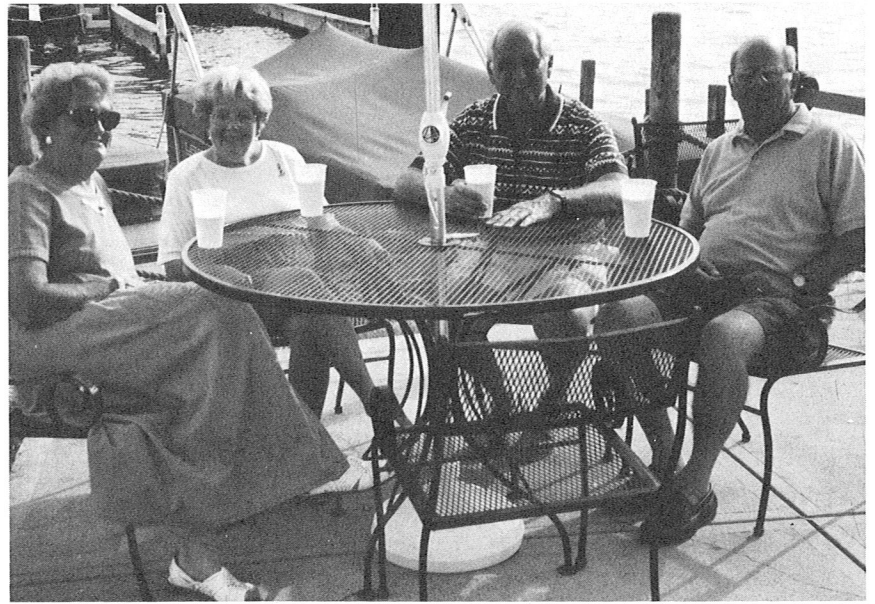
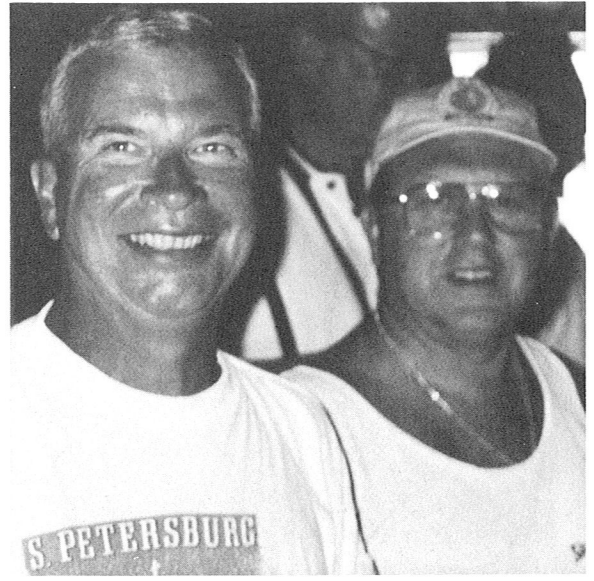
"She said, 'Now don't you dare take his picture, you paparazzi,'" Miller recalled.

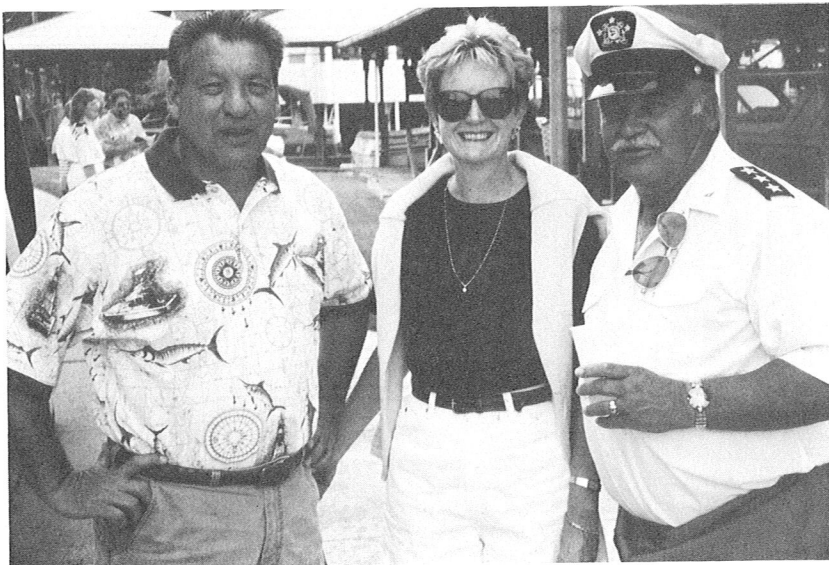

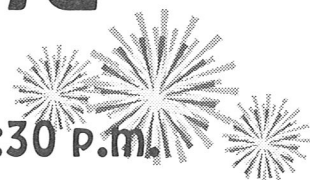
