

# Buckeye Lake Yacht Club



1) Unfortunately, several members have experienced vandalism to their boats while parked at the Club. There has not been any serious damage; however, valuables have been stolen from within the boats. These occurrences have taken place on Area 8 (the long pier extending from the Sayre Brothers store) during late June and early July. Members need to be aware of this problem and secure their boats when parked at the Club. A combination lock has been installed on the entrance gate to Area 8 and chain link fencing will be erected to make the pier more secure. Members may contact the Club Manager, me or any of the other Governors for the combination. The local police

authorities have beet contacted regarding this problem.

2) The BLYC Antique Wooden Boat Show is scheduled for August 21st, 22nd, and 23rd. Commodore John Sproat and his committee have been busy planning for this event for the last 12 months.
