

√ he 1998 fiscal year has ended and 1 will be assuming the duties of Log Governor for the next year. 1998 was an arduous year but I

feel a productive one for House and Grounds. With a facility the size and age of our clubhouse, one might expect that there will be constant problem areas in need of attention and that, in fact, is the case.

Aside from just dealing with the routine maintenance, I believe that the facility was improved over the past year with a number of significant changes including the installation of the smoke eater in the bar area, new fans in the bar and fireplace rooms, and relocated fans in the dining room. The front porch was recarpeted, new umbrellas were purchased for the pool bar and outdoor tables, and the clubhouse basement was rewired.

We also hired a consulting engineer to examine the clubhouse structure and determine its safety. I am happy to report that the structure appears to be in relatively good condition considering the age and environment. The engineer did recommend some structural changes which we will be implementing in the near future, along with our remodeling of the clubhouse.

In addition to the engineer, we contracted with a surveying firm to do a complete survey of the island and adjacent offisland area. This survey will assist with future changes to the clubhouse and parking areas.

More routine but significant maintenance was undertaken in painting the exterior of the second floor and cupola of the clubhouse, pointing the west clubhouse chimney, and repairing the erosion of the soil under the sidewalk

on the west side of the pool.

I thank the Ladies' Auxiliary for their financial contributions for the ceiling fans and porch carpeting, the Rueckels for their assistance in the carpet project, and the boards, staff, and membership for the assistance they provided. And of special note is the performance of Ted Hinterschied in dealing with the daily maintenance of the island flowers and grass.

t has been a pleasure to serve you as Docks and Rentals Governor for the last twelve months. I have enjoyed serving under the leader-

ship of Commodore Frank Foster, IV and this past year's fine Board of Governors and Trustees. It has been a terrific learning experience to understand how the Board and the Trustees work together to make the Club a better place for the members.

My assignment has been to make sure the club rentals were fully rented - similar to the duties of a property manager. Many of the new members may not realize the extent of the Club's rental facilities, so I'd like to share them with you. In addition to the 100 docks, the Club has 63 storage spaces in the Eastport boat yard, 9 garages, 6 rooms on the second floor of the Club, and 2 houses. These facilities are 98% rented and there is a lengthy waiting list for both the open and covered docks.

I have tried to make rental assignments as fair as possible when docks have become available. I have also tried to be as responsive as possible when other boaters may have unknowingly parked in someone else's dock.

I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Commodore John Sproat on an excellent Wooden Boat show. It would not have been possible if not for the generosity of those Club members who gave up their docks for that weekend. Also many thanks to Zenna Sayre for the use of her facilities during the show.

One of the biggest accomplishments this past year was to organize the Eastport boat yard. Members have found the facility easier to use since the addition of name signs on each member's storage space. There have been fewer instances of nonrenters just leaving boats and trailers in vacant spaces. This has resulted in more available rental spaces and thus more revenue for the Club.

There are still some storage spaces available in the Eastport boat yard. If you are in need of a place to store your boat for the winter, please feel free to give me a call.
