Facilities Improvement Committee

am pleased to report that we received an impressive response to the membership questionnaire that was distributed in



Governor Bill Quinn

November 1998. More than two hundred persons completed and returned the document.

As you may recall, the questionnaire asked the membership to rank the various functions, facilities, personnel and potential improvement projects on a scale of 1 to 5. "1" was the least desirable performance or least important improvement, "5" was the most desirable or most important.

The attached condensed questionnaire contains the weighted average score for each area evaluated by the membership. Most items were ranked above average or above 3.0. I am happy to report that the Board of Governor's ranking was exceeded only by the quantity of food served in our dinning room. I believe that the survey demonstrates that the majority of the members are pleased with the Club's current facilities and service, although there is always room for some improvement.

It was interesting to see that the respondents were evenly divided on the issue of limiting the membership and, judging from past comments, somewhat surprising that most are not uncomfortable with the private parties.

With regard to improvements, expanding or improving the docks (after all we are a yacht club), followed by redecorating the second floor, appear to be most important to the respondents. Expanding the Eastport storage area and installing an inside elevator were of least concern.

Slightly over one half of the respondents wrote in comments on the questionnaire. Although, there were many excellent suggestions, there was no consistent theme to report.

I would like to thank the members who chose to complete and return the questionnaire and Commodore Tim Maite for his help in compiling the results. Your participation in this survey gave the Board of Governors and the Facility Improvement Committee direction and focus for future enhancement to the Club.




