

Friday, April 30, Sailors' Night at BLYC was held. There was a good turnout and a good time was had by all. At our meeting, a number of 1999 events and "new" items were discussed. Here are some highlights:

• Lambrecht Cup - This year, sailors in the Cruising class will compete for the new Lambrecht Cup. This trophy will be awarded to the skipper with the best overall finish for le summer racing series. Rankings will be based on the best 8 finishes of the season. (Therefore, the more often you race the better your chances). This trophy has been named for one of BLYC's most beloved sailors - Commodore Chris Lambrecht. Chris has been an invaluable resource to the sailors of BLYC for many years. Chris was (and still is at age 91) an accomplished sailor and many of us at the BLYC have benefited from his guidance and tutelage. The winner's name will be engraved on a trophy that remains at the Club, along with receiving a trophy for his/her home trophy case. This should make for an exciting summer series this season. (NOTE: This race will not be handicapped- rankings will be based on actual finishing order)

• Teen Night at BLYC - Plans are currently being made for an event for the youth of our Club. This event will be held on Saturday, July 3, at the end of our final week of Junior Sailing Camp, Plans are to hold a race for the Juniors in the late afternoon, followed by a cookout and dance by the pool. The event will be open to all participants in Junior Sailing Camp as well as all children and grandchildren of members whether they attend camp or not. Details on time and costs will be forthcoming in the June Log.

• 2nd Annual "Geezers on Lasers" Race. Last year's race was such a success that we're going to try it again - Sunday, September 12. This race, in Laser Sailboats, is open to all sailors over the age of 50. The purpose is to have some fun and, hopefully, raise some money to help our Juniors go to Bay Week. We're anticipating high participation and crowds of spectators on the porch this year. Don Harris is determined to successfully defend his 1998 title - so get out there and practice! (The club has Laser sail boats that members can borrow for practice and race day.)

Adult Sailing "Camp," There have been a lot of requests for opportunities for adults at our Club to learn how to sail. Currently, Tracey Davis is working on plans to provide evening training sessions for all those interested. Details are still a bit sketchy but we're looking at 2 3-session camps. Most likely, the camps will be held early Friday or Tuesday evening and will run the last three weeks of June for the first camp, and the first three weeks of August for the second. Cost will be \$60 for all three sessions. Tracey is donating her time so that all proceeds from the camp can go to support

Junior Sailing. If you or a member of your family are interested, please call me at 740-928-1763 so we can gauge interest and finalize plans.

Plans for Junior Sailing Camp are shaping up. The information was printed in the April Log and reservations have been coming in. This is one of the greatest experiences that we, as a Club, can provide to our children and grandchildren. The Juniors have a lot of fun while learning skills that will last a lifetime -not just how to sail, but also the 'intangibles' that come from such an experience as well. The registration form is printed again in this issue - get your Juniors registered soon to guarantee their spots for this year's camp!

A big thank you to all who helped with sailing projects at the Spring Work Day, April 18. We got a lot accomplished! I would also like to thank Bill McIntyre, Dan Knaul, and Walter Grubb, Jr. for all of their help in preparing for the summer season, They have been an invaluable resource in planning some of the great things that we're going to try this summer.
