



The annual meeting will be Sept. 19 at 2 p.m. when the following slate of officers will be presented;



BLYC BOAT HITS TRUCK

'Tween the Trees Cruise Imperiled

t was the first and only radio call of its kind throughout the 316 mile, 3-day cruise. "Fox, this is Dolphin. We've got a problem back here. Glenford is overheating and dead in the water. You'd better hold 'em up."

With that call at 1505 hours (3:05 p.m.) Saturday, July 31, the remaining fleet of 5 BLYC boats comprising this year's Homer Tussing Memorial 'Tween the Trees Cruise, throttled back and began to rock in the gentle swells of the Ohio River. On board, captains and crews began silently weighing alternatives to continuing as a 6-vessel fleet.

All such thinking quickly proved unnecessary. Within minutes, Jerry Boundy - Dolphin's captain and one of the planners of this year's cruise - was back on the radio. "Glenford's restarted and her temperature is coming down. She'll be ready to go in a minute or two. No problem. She just hit a truck."

A truck?

True enough. Guessing that the problem might be an obstructed water intake on *Glenford's* stern drive, pilot Charlie Baldwin reversed the Sea Ray's throttle and revved the engine hard. An instant later, a yellow plastic toy truck bobbed to the surface, its sides split in such a way as to turn it into a snugfitting if unwelcome seal to *Glenford's* engine cooling system

With that problem corrected, the fleet resumed its beautifully spaced formation and continued the cruise that had begun 2 days earlier when 6 BLYC boats, their captains and crews gathered in Marietta, Ohio to begin this year's adventure. This was the 4th of 5 legs of the current series of cruises that is taking our intrepid fleet from Pittsburgh, PA to Rising Sun, IN - the entire length of the Ohio River forming the southern boundary of the state - in 5 years. Next year will complete the series with a giant celebration in Rising Sun and all BLYC members are urged to sign on and make the cruise as captains, mates or crews.

Highlights of this year's cruise came early and often. Putting out from Marietta at 1000 hours on Fri-

day, July 30, the fleet was soon treated to the sight of the mighty sternwheeler *Mississippi Queen* as she raised her ramp from the flats of Blennerhassett Island and began to steam upriver.

At 1140 hours the fleet passed through the first of 6 locks it would navigate during the 3-day cruise. Jerry and Jo-Ann Boundy, with crew Tim and Martha Maite, made it look easy, a tribute to their years of experience as river runners. (Jo-Ann again copied, assembled, and color-coded the many pages of charts required for the voyage, making complete sets available to all captains). First-timers Miles and Jane Waggoner with crew Ray and Jeanne Murray aboard Miles To Go soon got the hang of slipping a line around a floating bitt and riding it up or down the damp canyon of an Ohio River lock.

At 1250 hours the crew stopped for lunch in the cool shade of Buffington Island. As last year, Randy McClure - mate aboard husband Kevin's cuddy cabin Flounder - lost no time in slipping into the water for a swim. She was soon followed by Ken and Mary Keller, captain and mate aboard Fox, and by Fox crewmate Barb Poplis. Husband Paul remained on board to set out a lunch of cheese, lunch meats, and pickles handmade by Barb's brother, former Cincinnati Reds pitcher and current Reds broadcaster, Chris Welch.

Another lock and the fleet was ready to tie up for the night at the Gallipolis Boat Club. Captains and crews overnighted in Gallipolis' Holiday Inn. Here, Nick and Michelle DeSantis joined Jim and Jane Shriner as crewmates aboard Howard and Rosa Clark's *My Princess*, and Charlie Baldwin's wife Geri joined the crew of *Glenford*.

Late that evening, captains and crews were advised by Jerry Boundy and Ken Keller that the next 4 locks they would pass through would operate only once each even-numbered hour, and that such a schedule dictated an earlier departure than planned for the following morning. At 0905 hours Saturday morning the fleet returned to the Ohio River via a very shallow Chickamauga Creek and promptly at 1000 hours entered the first lock of the day.

At 1145 hours the fleet was called on to render assistance to a heavily loaded pleasure boat that had run ou of gas in mid-river. *Flounder* to the rescue; the foresighted McClures simply produced a 5-gallon jerry can filled with fuel, Randy swam the 2 boats together, the fuel was exchanged, and soon a grateful captain and his crew were again underway.

Following *Glenford's* "collision" with the truck (captain Whit Tussing had temporarily turned the helm over to his Uncle Charlie when the incident occurred; first mate and sister of Charlie, Mary Lou Tussing, was not on the bridge at the time), the fleet passed Portsmouth at 1700 hours and put into Shawnee State Park Marina at 1720 hours.

A great banquet at Portsmouth's Ramada Inn, planned by Mary Keller, was delayed but not diminished by unforeseen transportation problems getting captains and crews from the marina to the motel. A generous-spirited member of Portsmouth's Wesley Methodist Church, contacted by a state park warden, voluntarily drove the entire fleet into town in the church's brand new bus, then drove everyone back to the marina in the morning, and had to be hard-pressed to accept a donation for his efforts. Only when he was assured that he could donate it to the church did he accept. That's living the faith.

The next morning the fleet was off promptly at 0900 hours. The river was smooth as glass and the 6 boats presented a dazzling display of fine seamanship to the many persons driving or boating nearby. The day passed without incident until the final lock of the cruise when all crews were thoroughly soaked by a brief but intense downpour. It wasn't raining as the fleet entered the lock and the rain had stopped some 20 minutes later as the BLYC boats left the lock. But in between, the southern Ohio drought was briefly abated. In spades.

The fleet left the Ohio River at Gallipolis Boat Club at 1500 hours on Sunday to begin loading boats on trailers for the long trip home. All boats, captains and crews returned safely with lifetime memories and a firm resolve to be a part of next year's adventure. Why not plan on joining us?






