



A special thanks to Jim Shriner and Tom Campbell for showing me how to install the bubble system and for doing most of the work on the installation. It was a 4 1/2 to 5 hour job; thanks guys for your help.

Off-island projects completed or in process, starting with the basics, are:

We have started clean up at Eastport, along the water front bank by removing weeds, brush, and trash. It looks much better. Next, we are going to do the fence line around the boat yard and then clean up the yard itself. 


