



Cruise Planners Announce Marina Destinations

Planning for this year's renewal of the 'Tween the Trees Cruise now includes marinas that have agreed to overnight the BLYC fleet.

Captains and their crews will assemble Thursday evening, August 3, at Shawnee State Park, just west of Portsmouth. Boats will be launched yet that evening in the Park's lovely marina.

Overnight accommodations have been made in the fleet's name at the Park lodge, but all reservations must be individually confirmed by calling the lodge at 740-858-6621 by June 21. Identify yourself as

part of the BLYC group.

Friday morning at 1000 hours, the fleet will set out on the Ohio River, passing through the Captain Anthony Meldahl Lock (the only lock on this year's cruise) before pausing for the night at Watertown Yacht Club on the Kentucky shore, just upriver from downtown Cincinnati, a distance of 104 miles. Watertown is within a short distance of several waterfront theme

restaurants and attractions.

The next morning the fleet will continue west some 25 miles to just beyond the inflow of the Great Miami River - the point marking the Ohio/ Indiana state line - thereby completing the 5-year, 5-leg, thousand mile round trip from Ohio River mile marker 0 in downtown Pittsburgh to the Indiana state line - the whole of the river beneath Ohio.

Following a brief ceremony, the fleet will either return to Cincinnati or press further west as individual captains and crews choose.

Saturday night, the fleet returns to Watertown

Yacht Club, and on Sunday to Shawnee State Park Marina and the trip home. Still in planning are the overnight accommodations for Friday and Saturday nights and the celebratory banquet. Watch the Log for more information.

Over the winter, a number of exciting developments in sailing have occurred—some new boats, people "jumping ship" to crew for other skippers, new sails, etc.it's starting to be just like the America's Cup (except that the boats are smaller, the lake's not as deep as the ocean, and nobody has \$50 million to put into their racing team). The Sailing Instructions for the Sunday Racing series were handed out as well. If you need a copy, please contact me. On Sunday, April 30, we held (or will hold - depending on when this Log arrives in your mailbox) training for this years Race Committee. Being on the race committee is an easy, fun way to be a part of the sailing excitement at BLYC. We're still looking for people to help out at the Race Shack for Sunday races. Please contact me if you're interested. You even get a free T-shirt for serving on the race committee - what a deal!

The racing calendar has been finalized and is posted around the Club. We will be racing every Sunday beginning May 14 through October 1, except July 23 (BLYC Golf Outing), August 20 (Commodore Bob Dye Poker Run and Wooden Boat Regatta), September 10 (3rd Annual Geezers on Lasers Race), and September 17 (Elections). Plans are being finalized for Junior

Sailing Camp this year. This year's sailing camp staff will be as follows: Tracey Davis, Stone Parker, Justin Evans, and Nathan Owen. Others will be helping out from time to time as well. Sailing Camp is a great opportunity for young people at BLYC. A week of fun, fellowship, and learning. This year, we will be starting a new system to track the progress of each individual sailor to better fit their learning needs in the future. Usually, sailors will take the "Beginner" course at least the first 2 years (Beginner I & Beginner II), then move onto the Intermediate course. Sailors in the Advanced course will focus on racing and crewed boats. If you have questions on what course your Junior should be in, please feel free to give me a call. Sailing is a great activity for young people and teaches skills beyond the basics of getting the boat to go teamwork, cooperation, fair-play, self-reliance, and safety, just to name a few. The cost will be \$160 per week for children and grandchildren of members and \$175 for non-members. The cost includes lunch. Camp runs Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Sailors should bring a swimsuit, towel, life-jacket, and suitable shoes with them each day of camp. Registration can be sent to BLYC to my attention. Please register your juniors soon to insure them a spot. Enrollment is limited for safety and registration is on a first-come, first-served basis.

Sailboat Racing begins May 14

Junior Sailors Usher in the 2000 Sailing Season at BLYC

On Thursday, March 30, while most sailors were thinking about how nice the weather was for sailing, skipper Justin Evans and crew Amanda Newman were taking BLYC's new Club Junior sailboat out on the lake for the first practice of the season. Well-prepared, enthusiastic, and donning their wet suits, Justin & Amanda set out on the 40° waters of Buckeye Lake to put the new boat through the paces. The winds were moderate out of the west and the Juniors enjoyed a relaxing 2-hour sail getting to know their new boat. Justin and Amanda will be competing for BLYC in several Junior Races at Interlake Yachting Association Club Races, including Junior Bay Week at Put-in-Bay.

Justin, a senior at Granville High School, is the son of members Mike & Becky Evans. Justin will be competing in his 4th I-LYA Junior Bay Week this year. In 1997 and 1998, he raced in the Laser class. Last year, along with crew Kyle Maite, Justin raced for BLYC in a Club Junior borrowed from Dennison University. College sailing has different equipment rules than Junior Sailing so our team was at a disadvantage, having no spinnaker. However, they still finished in the top half of the fleet in the Commodore's Series and were frequently in front of the pack at the first mark (upwind, before the other teams used their spinnakers on the downwind leg and caught up). With the new boat (including a brand new red and white spinnaker), Justin is setting his sights high for the 2000 season. Justin's brothers, Seth and Cameron, have also participated in Junior Sailing at BLYC. Justin plans on attending college in Boston in the fall. His reason for picking the school, "They've got a really good sailing program." Now that's dedication to a sport!

Amanda, a senior at Newark High School, is the granddaughter of members Stone & Donna Parker. Although this will be Amanda's first year racing

for BLYC, she has participated several years, along with her cousins, in Junior Sailing Camp at the Club. Amanda plans on attending Denison University this fall.

This past winter, the Board approved the purchase of the two new Club Junior Sailboats for the growing Junior Sailing Program at BLYC. The boats arrived in late February and the Junior Sailors have been anxiously awaiting good weather to get out on the water. The new boats are a key part of BLYC's efforts to increase participation and quality in sailing and junior sailing here at Buckeye Lake. This year, for the first time in several years, BLYC plans to send 4 boats, and 6 junior sailors to Bay Week and at least one to the I-LYA Optimist Championships. Don't forget to attend the Auction and bring all of your friends. The auction items are on display at the Club now so pick out your favorites.



House & Grounds

o many things have happened, or are in progress as result of our April 5 House and Grounds Committee Meeting, our April 13

Board Meeting, and Work Day on April 16 that I can only note highlights. I will do a "pick-up" article next month with further updates, but for the sake of Log space this month, let me offer just a few highlights.

First, returning to our Commodores' Lounge refurbishing effort. We are adding a wallpaper border to the newly painted hallway and entrance. Don Lemmon's masterpiece of wall restoration and painting (how did he do that, yes it is paint not wallpaper) will be enhanced by a sailing-oriented border selected by our interior decorator, Peggy Wells. The border design was approved by the Commodores' Lounge committee, the Board and Trustees, and a random sampling of members. The border will be a further reflection of our Club's dedication to sailing and support of Governor Harris' efforts.

Steve McClain and Nancy Benson made a significant contribution that has allowed us to have many of the Club's historic pictures professionally framed, matted, and protected with light resistant glass. The pictures will be hung in the hallway and entrance so that everyone can enjoy them. I know many of you have missed these pictures, Guy Brown indicated to me that he particularly enjoyed looking at the pictures, and that history is an important part of the Club. Hopefully, I will get some help from our Historian, Commodore Frank Foster III, Steve and Nancy, and others so we can provide some information in later Logs of the history reflected in the pictures. Again, thanks Steve and Nancy for your generosity and apprecia-

tion for BLYC history!

Another Commodores' Lounge work-in-progress enhancement should be completed by the time you get this Log. A relatively new member, Mark Russell, provided us with his professional expertise and advice. Mark is the owner of Hang Ups, Inc. in Bexley and specializes in window coverings. The Board agreed to purchase 2-inch Olympian golden oak wood horizontal blinds. The old blinds were taken down Work Day, and we are ready for Mark's professional installation in April. We will have top-of-the-line blinds that will blend well with the current decor and will be functional. The old blinds were "stylewise" dated, and did not work. Mark also was one of our tireless Work Day participants. Mark for your efforts and tools. Again, thanks!

We now have a newly refurbished and functional "BLYC" neon sign mounted on the second floor roof over the porch steps. The old sign did not work and looked pretty bad after years of weathering. The new sign look features larger white block BLYC letters on a blue back ground that is easier to see during the day. At night, we again have our alternating blue-red neon BLYC letters to guide us back to port. I want to thank Jesse Howard for his contribution to this effort. Jesse and his electrical contracting company have helped the Club in many ways throughout the years. Looking forward to seeing Jesse this summer. A Log picture of Jesse and the sign will be in order. I will also try to relay some of the history of the sign in a later log, (can anyone help?) It would be great to know what Commodore and Board, and/or member(s) were initially responsible for the sign, and the date of it first appearance as a traditional fixture of the BLYC.

Another Club enhancement project is now complete. Running out of space in this Log, but if you get a chance go upstairs, look at the cupola area. Allen, our house maintenance man has restored the bead board. Looking good,

Allen! Thank you, David, for you guidance and initiative. More later.

During our House and Grounds Committee meeting, Joe Campbell recommended that we install a window air conditioner in the second floor men's room and shower. We do not have central air upstairs and it does get really hot up there during the summer. If you, or someone you know have a small window air unit that we could purchase, or that is available through a donation, let Joe Campbell or me know. We eventually may be remodeling the second floor, including central air, and we do not want to spend at lot at this time until more second floor decisions are made, including a timeline.

Not to worry, the POOL is on schedule for opening May 28th. The Board and Trustee approved the cost of painting the pool. It has been four or five years since our last full painting. Don Lemmon has been able to touch up the pool each year, but it was time to completely clean, prep, and paint the entire pool again. Long term pool maintenance and refurbishing will be discussed, but as a result of Don Lemmon's expertise and efforts, the pool should look good for the next several summers. Thanks Don!

Also, a special thanks to Ted Hinterschied for his efforts to drain the pool in readiness for painting. Ted spends a lot of time for the good of the Club, particularly with respect to daily summer landscaping. Many of Ted's efforts go unnoticed since he is at the Club when we are closed or when most members are not there. A big thanks, Ted!

As 1 indicated above, I am running out of space for this Log, but a few notes about Spring Work Day. Approximately 34 members attended Work Day. I will provide greater detail next month. However, you will hopefully find our Work Day pictures in this Log this month. Governor Jim Tompson was quite busy with his digital camera. My new name for Jim is "Governor Digital". Thanks Jim!
