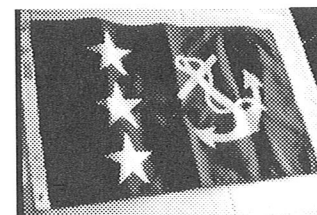

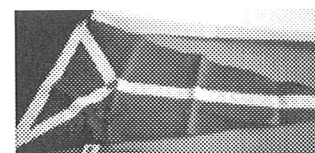

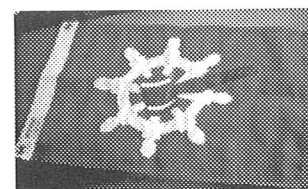

This burgee with white on blue background is for the Commodore, white on red is for the Vice Commodore and red on white is for the Rear Commodore.

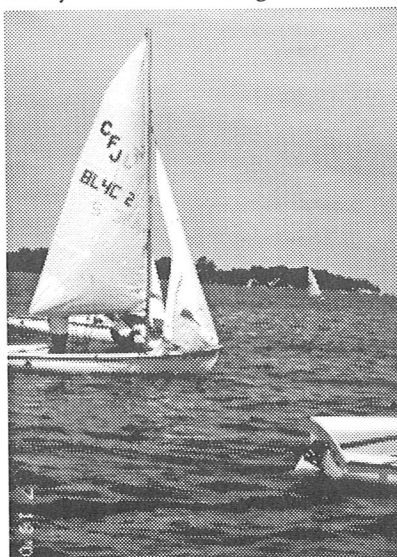

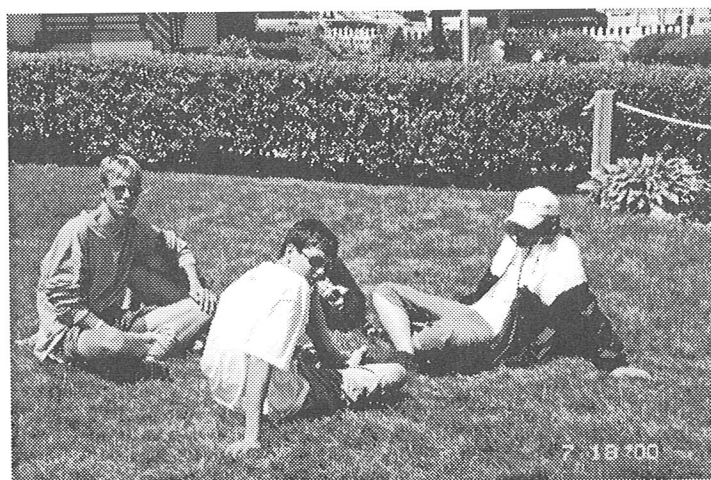

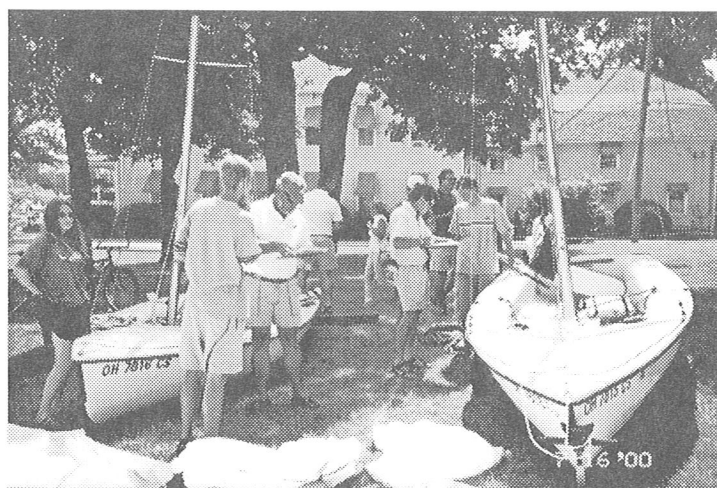
Relaxing at "The Bay"

Waiting to Launch

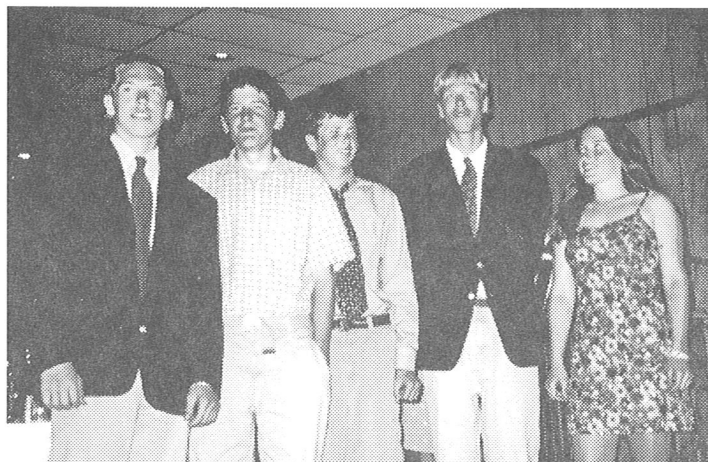

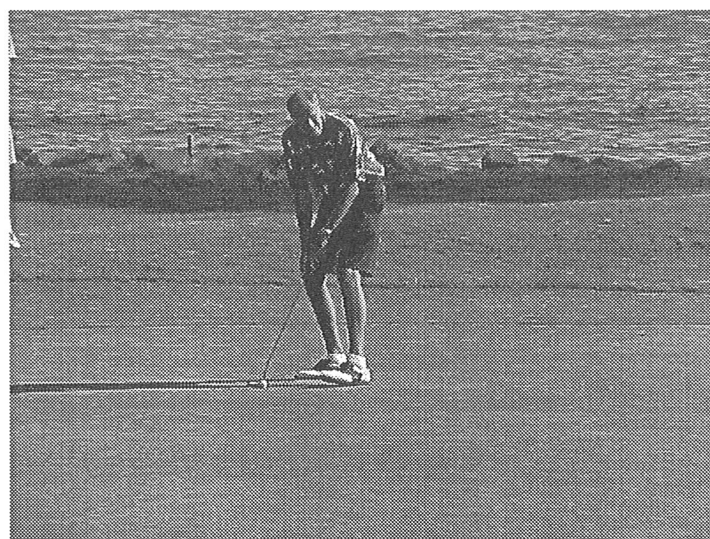

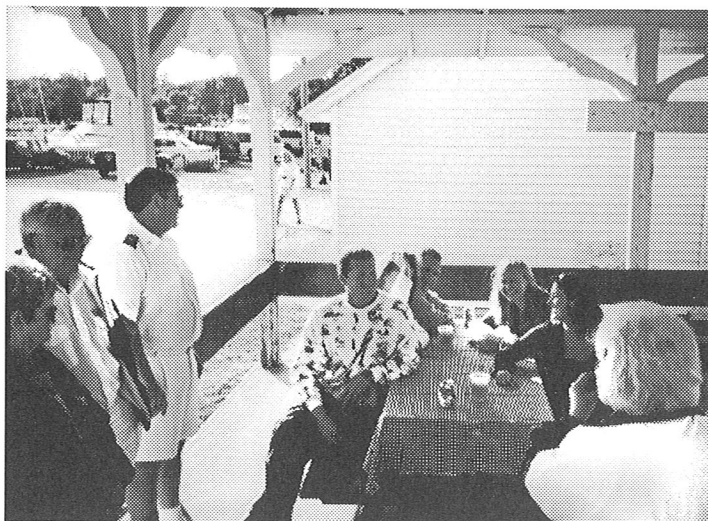

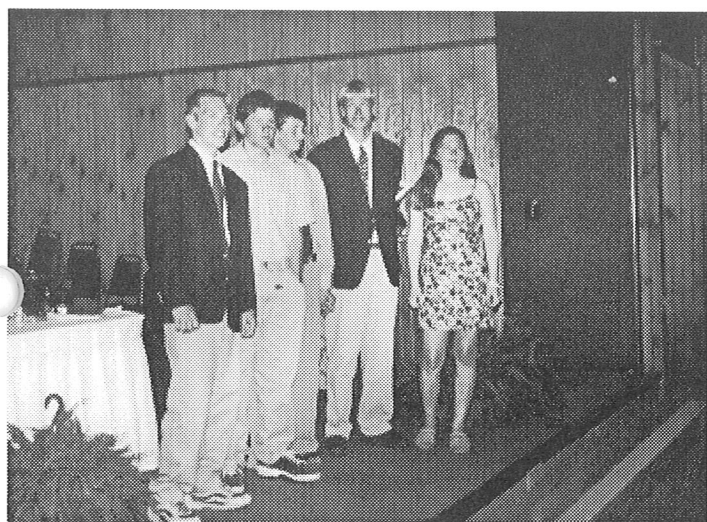
