



BLYC Completes Epic Adventure

Five years, 492 Ohio River miles, 12 locks. Add in 9 miles of Allegheny River and an additional lock. Now double the mileage and the number of locks to account for the return trip of each leg and you begin to have an idea of the magnitude of the undertaking just completed by participants in BLYC's "Tween the Trees Cruise."



Named in honor of the late Homer Tussing, who when asked to command an earlier Club cruise replied, "There's nothing to a river trip - just keep it between the trees." The five year, five leg adventure took the BLYC fleet from Ohio River mile marker 0 in the shadow of Pittsburgh's Three Rivers Stadium to daymark #491.2 on the Indiana state line - the whole of the Ohio beneath the river's namesake state.

Planned and fleet commanded the last three years by the team of Jerry and Jo-Ann Boundy and Ken and Mary Keller, these four Club members - together with former Commodore Tim and Martha Maite—completed the entire Pittsburgh to Indiana state line cruise, though engine trouble kept the Kellers from finishing the return portion of this year's leg.


As it turned out, mechanical problems were something of a theme of this year's cruise as first one boat and then another required attention. Just minutes into the trip, Nauti-Gal — skippered by Whit Tussing with mother Mary Lou aboard — began to overheat. With help from crew members Charlie and Gerri Baldwin and Dave Oyer, Nauti-Gal was soon back in formation. This was the Tussing's third leg, the Baldwins second

and Dave Oyer's first.

A short while later, Flounder, skippered by Kevin McClure with first mate Randy, needed a moment to make some adjustments before resuming its position in line. This was leg #3 for the McClures.

Commodore Howard Clark, first mate Rosa and crew members Jim and Jane Shriner aboard My Princess came through the cruise without incident, the second consecutive leg for both couples. But for the Boundy's Dolphin, it was a different story.

Following a brief fleet ceremony at daymark 491.2, the Boundys, Maites and Kellers pressed on to mile marker 500.0, a personal goal for the three couples. After lunch, the two boats began the return trip to the fleet's overnight accommodations at Watertown Yacht Club in Dayton, Kentucky, across the river and just east of downtown Cincinnati. Within seconds, Dolphin quit dead in the water and would not restart. The Kellers aboard their son's bowrider Pierless (the Kellers' cruiser Fox had suffered major engine damage two weeks before that prevented it from making the Ohio River trip) passed a line to Dolphin and towed her to a nearby marina.



Diagnosed as a broken fuel pump, the problem was solved when the Cincinnati-based SeaRay salesman, who sold Dolphin to the Boundys, agreed to personally deliver a replacement pump to them on his way home from the dealership that evening. Jerry managed a field installation of the new pump and brought Dolphin safely back to Watertown just a few hours later than planned.

First-timers making this year's cruise included Tom and Brigette Charles with crew Ken and Crista Marshall aboard Crown, and Tom and JoAnn Dodds with crew Don and Marty Westhoven aboard Tommy's Tribe. An eighth boat, Heron, began the trip but did not complete either leg of the voyage. Aboard were Phil and Kandi Cook, Mike and Sharon Kappas and Luke and Cathi Lucas.

Though they did not take part in this year's cruise, several BLYC boating families made more than one of the five legs of the journey. Among these were former Commodore Fred and Ruth Wright (3) and Bob and Peg Yerke (3).

With the Kellers out of the lead position on the return leg for the first time in four years, Whit Tussing, aboard Nauti-Gal, appropriately and effectively led the fleet home to Shawnee State Park Marina in the final cruise in honor of his late father. Rest easy, Homer. We kept it "between the trees."
















Howard and Rosa Clark give initial check to establish a trust for the benefit of a Buckeye Lake Yacht Club sailor in his first year of college.


