





pring is here! It sure seems like winter was longer this year than usual, maybe just colder. No matter, now it's time to gear up for

the 2001 Sailing Season at the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club.

As usual, we will kick off the Sunday racing series on Mother's Day, May 13. Races will start at 2:00 p.m. with the pre-race Skippers Meeting being held at 1:30. This year will bring some changes to our racing. First, the Cruising class will be handicapping finish times according to the PHRF rating system. There's still a lot of work that needs to be done to get ready for this, but Stone Parker and Russ Green have been working hard and I'm sure that we'll be ready. If you have any questions about handicapping, please con-

tact either Stone Parker, (740) 246-4239, or me, (740) 928-1763. The second change will be the addition of a one-design class to our regular races. Governor Tom Shain and Jason Comstock have been working to recruit other Flying Scot sailors for our Club. Hopefully, we'll be able to get three boats on the line regularly so that they can compete, along with the Cruising class, for the Lambrecht Cup. It would be really exciting if we have to do a sail-off between class champions this year.

Things are coming together for Junior Sailing as well. I am pleased to announce that this year's Junior Racing Team will be coached by Stone Parker and Brett Pfahl. Brett joined BLYC last spring and has jumped right into Junior Sailing. He's got some great ideas and his enthusiasm is contagious. Stone has been a major part of the growth the program's seen in the past couple of years. With the two of them together and plenty of support from the membership, our Juniors should have a great year.

Junior Sailing camp dates have been set and are somewhat different than in the past. This year, we will run two week-long camps in June. The Beginner camp will be the week of June 18-22. The Intermediate camp will be the week of June 25-29. If these two weeks fill up, we will add another week of Beginner camp in late July. Advanced camp this year will not be a week-long experience, but instead these Juniors will meet on five Tuesday evenings throughout the summer. We are calling the advanced camp "Racing Camp" this year. The focus will be on boat speed, racing rules, and tactics. The Racing Camp will meet on June 12, 19, & 26, and July 3 & 10 from 5:00 p.m. until dark (about 9:30). The cost for camp this year will be the same as in 2000; \$160 per session for children and grandchildren of members, \$175 for nonmembers. Juniors participating in camp should be at least 9 years old and know how to swim. (We are currently working on putting a "mini-camp" together for 5-8 year olds in Optimist sailboats.


I'm sure that, like me, you've all got cleaning and tuning to do on your boats. So put down the Log – there's less than 6 weeks until the first race!
