

old on to your sails! Our BLYC summer season is here! Entertainment and special dining was successfully expanded this winter. How-

ever, in the back of everyone's mind was summer. Wait no longer, take advantage of our traditional summer slate of fun, food and beverage, comradeship, and entertainment. Mark your calendars now! Those of you who were fortunate enough to have spent the winter in warmer climates, or prefer taking advantage of membership during the summer months, will find that we have gained momentum while you were away. Welcome back!

Thanks to the efforts of our staff and Vice Commodore Shriner, we do not have to "gear up" our Bar and Kitchen to get ready to serve you this summer. Food and service have been great all winter and we're ready now!

As most of you know, our entire bar and kitchen operations budget is dependent upon having well attended parties and events during the summer. Monies are allocated each year to support entertainment. The annual entertainment budget is established (supported by your dues) to subsidize the cost of bands, decorations, fliers, and other costs associated with entertainment. However, during the summer two "special events" are planned that are not subsidized by the budget. These two events (in addition to the Antique and Classic Boat Show) are designed to be self-supporting, which means that we must sell tickets to cover costs including bands, table and chair rentals, security, decorations, etc. We plan these two events with the anticipation of greater attendance as a result of their uniqueness and the enhanced level of entertainment that is provided.

To summarize, entertainment expenses are not included in what you pay for budgeted entertainment functions summer or winter, (prices reflect bar and kitchen costs only); however, entertainment expenses associated with our two special events must be offset through the sale of tickets. Special event ticket prices are established at a projected break-even point, based upon costs and attendance.

Our two special events this year are the Animal House Toga Party on June 30th, and the U.S.O. Night at the Crystal Ballroom on July 14th. In addition to band and party entertainment, don't forget our Junior Sailors and Sunday afternoon racing. Governor Harris has worked diligently all winter in preparation for this year's BLYC sailing season. If you are a sailor help make it happen; if you are not, sailing should be part of your entertainment plans as a supporter and spectator.

Now after all of that "business stuff" let the fun and summer begin!


We'll have cocktails and some hors d' oeuvres from around 5:00 to 6:00 p.m. before the evening gets going.
