

# Membership & Directory


o all my fellow BLYC members, Fall is upon us around here at the Club. Fall at this Club has some special

The second new Member is Denny Heller with his first mate, Tami. Denny's sponsors were Greg Stonelock and Don Lemmon.


I would like to welcome these two new members into the Club. Let's all make them feel right at home here at BLYC,




The Discretionary Award this year went to our amiable Commodore Nick De Santis, with a trophy inscribed, "Just One Helluva Nice Guy." What more be said.
