BLYC Website Gets a New Look!



rom your ever concerned and ever working Governor: a new job brings new problems:



Subject: Governor Don Lemmon Boat docks and trailer spaces at East Port.

If in the past you have been misled or told that you can park or use an unoccupied boat dock or trailer space, this is incorrect. All of our available boat docks and trailer spaces have been rented at this time, and if you are parked or docked in a space not rented by you, you need to move your boat or trailer. These spots are to be used only by the people who have rented them. If you have a rented space and wish to allow someone else to use your spot, you need to notify the board in writing.

This is a procedure that has been in effect for a long time. We need to follow this procedure in order to secure the rental agreements with our membership, and to assure members that their spaces will always be available for them. Many of our members do not use their spaces all

the time. But, their spaces need to be honored by their rental agreements. No one is permitted to park in them without written permission by the person who has rented the dock or trailer space. There are no exceptions to this procedure. All unauthorized boats and trailers will be moved to unsecured areas.
