

## From the Log of Stanley Deutsch, Sept. 12, 2002 – Sept. 15, 2002

I participated in the "Parade of Sail," a Sail for America event in New York Harbor on Saturday, September 14, 2002. The gathering of about 1600 sailboats was organized to honor the memory of those lost on September 11th, 2001, to symbolize the vitality of New York City, and the spirit of America. Buckeye Lake Yacht Club was one of the sponsoring yacht clubs of this event, and we hoisted the BLYC burgee on our ship.

On Thursday, September 12, my friend, Jerome Pendleton, and I met my brother-in-law, Bruce Topolosky, and boarded his sailboat, The Majesty, a Tartan 372, in the historic port of Milford, Connecticut. We sailed west to Port Washington, New York, Manhasset Bay. We spent Friday ashore in Port Washington and visited the Knickerbacher Yacht Club. We were met by my niece, Sara Topolosky, and her fiancée Steve on Friday night. Sara works for New York Empire Blue Cross and Blue Shield and was in Tower 1 of the World Trade Center when the first plane hit. She remembers being helped out of the building by firemen who later perished.

Saturday morning, we left Port Washington on the north shore of Long Island and sailed southwest to the Throgsneck Bridge, the north end of the East River. Our group of about 600 sailing ships motored close together and all monitored the lead ship on channel 68. After passing Hellsgate, the confluence of the East and Harlem Rivers known for strong current, eddies, and tides, we passed Roosevelt Island where the river narrows. Coast Guard and Police boats guarded the area around the United Nations. After passing the Williamsburg, Manhattan, and Brooklyn Bridges, we entered upper Manhattan Bay. We could see the Statue of Liberty and we joined two other groups of sailboats. At noon, the group leader had all ships turn into the wind and about 1600 sailboats in all raised their sails. This was, truly, an awesome sight.

The John J. Harvey Fireboat came down the Hudson River from "Ground Zero" to the Statue of Liberty. This signaled the start of our parade up the Hudson River to "Ground Zero." Many ships carried memorial name flags for each of the 2700 who died on September 11th. "Ground Zero" was marked by a huge American Flag draped on the front of a building facing the Hudson River. As each ship sailed past, someone over the ship-to-shore radio read the names of the dead from their memorial flags and ended with "God Bless America." We turned around at the George Washington Bridge and returned to New York Harbor.

My niece, a survivor of September 11<sup>th</sup> sat on the starboard settee with her fiancée. We had been a part of a dignified remembrance and a glorification of freedom.





