



However, even with this kitchen layout adjustment, we need your help! Reservations please. If you make a reservation and leave a message on our phone recorder, please specify the time you want to be seated, not the time you plan to arrive at the Club.

Most members enjoy having a beverage or two, and talking with their friends at the bar prior to dining. If you want to personally talk to Fritz or other staff regarding your service needs or reservation, the best time to call is Wednesday through Sunday after 2:00 p.m.

By the time you receive this April Log, a new menu should be in place. Again, as a work in progress, your suggestions and input will be appreciated once the menu is ready.
