

Buckeye Lake made history at the Full Pool Breakfast this year. Tim Moore from ODNR told me it

is the first time in 18 years that the lake has not been at full pool by May 1st! There is definitely an increase in activity around the docks and boatyard as everyone is excited about getting boats into the lake. But first, I think our sailors and boaters are more anxiously awaiting rising water! Let's hope for a soggy start to May.

As you are working or boating around the docks, please notice that new swim ladders have been installed. There are five ladders in the Front Basins and one each at the Covered Docks, Area 8 and Eastport Docks. This provides an extra measure of safety in case anyone tumbles into the water.

There are currently 14 docks available, two in the back basin for small boats or wave-runners, six sailboat docks and six powerboat docks. There are 13 spaces available in the boatyard. There are four people on the Open Dock Waiting List that have not yet chosen a dock. Garages are full, but I have started a Waiting List. Please notify me if you would like to be put on the list. There is also a Waiting List for the Front Basins as well as the Covered Docks. These are posted at the back of the dock list at the Club.

Your Board of Governors and Trustees are very committed to safety, so as we enter into the summer season, please remember the Club rule requiring life jackets on your children, grand-children or visiting children age 12 or below whenever they are on the island or on the docks.


We look forward to seeing you on the "Big Lake" and hope that you will join in the camaraderie and fellowship of your fellow BLYC members in this event.
