


This is also a busy season at the Club docks and yard, as members get ready to utilize the boatyard for the fall and winter. I know some members will wait as long as possible to take their boat out, but I would like to remind everyone that there could be a trailer parked in your spot as some got moved around to make it easier for the yard to be mowed, etc. If you have a trailer parked at the yard, please make sure it is not in an assigned member's spot! Also, as you move your trailer or boat please keep the lift area free, as it will be used

at least through October.

There have been numerous complaints regarding non-members on the docks and maintaining security takes everyone's cooperation. The combinations were changed on the dock gates at the request of members. The combination remains the same on the boatyard. Non-members have already had access to the new combination! Please do not give the combination to non-members as it defeats the purpose of having the docks and boatyard locked! I need to remind everyone that our docks are for Members Only (with the exception of the guest slips in front of the Club) and that any boat in your assigned slip needs to be registered in your name. This is checked periodically throughout the year. If you have special circumstances, please let me know. If you find a boat in your slip, please call me, as occasionally someone simply parks in the wrong spot. If I am unable to contact you, or the boat in question is not registered to the slip owner, the boat will be towed. Per the Club bylaws, the Club has the authority to move your boat at any time (for a valid reason) and a boat not registered to a member will be towed. In addition, sub-letting of your slip is not allowed.

I would like to thank everyone who moved his or her boat for the Wooden Boat Show. I sincerely appreciate your cooperation and realize it is disruptive to some of our members and apologize for the inconvenience. This show is a tradition and gives many people an opportunity to see the Club. We had a wonderful show this year and Commodore Maite did a great job!
