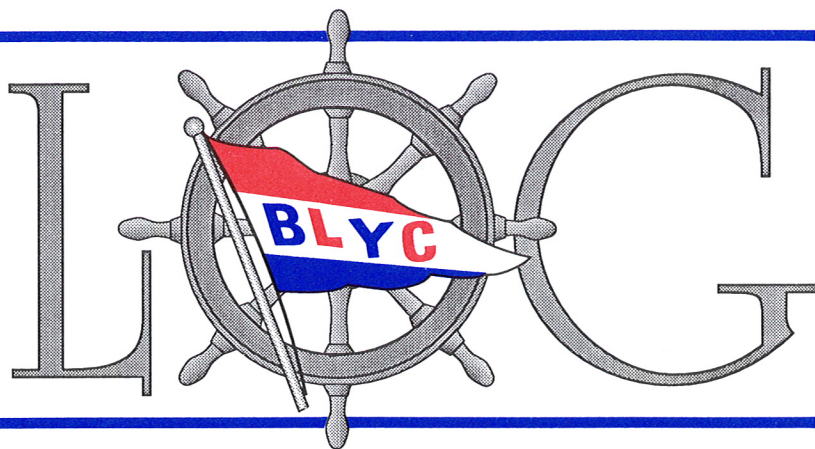

I goofed! Our new lunch and dinner menu was not ready by the first of October. However, by the time you receive this November Log we will have had two-three weeks to test the new menu. Chef Troy and Rear Commodore Mark Russell, as Bar and Kitchen Governor worked diligently the week after elections to finalize the new menu. Consideration was given to members' bar and kitchen survey information and cost/pricing objectives. By combining the most popular items from last year's "work-in progress" menu with a selection mix of traditional favorites, members and guests will have an interesting variety of choices each and every time they dine at the Club. Pricing is determined by food costs and the margin that is required to cover expenses associated with staffing and miscellaneous non-food kitchen costs — such as the replacement of the food processor in

October. Our pricing objective, unlike for-profit restaurants, is to break-even. Our goal is to provide the highest quality food possible within a pricing structure that is reasonable, based upon that quality objective. Add in the hard work and skill of Chef Troy and his staff, you will not find a better value for your dining dollar in the area, whether at a commercial restaurant or a private club. In our attempt to break even, the one variable that we cannot control in our bar and kitchen operation is YOU. Please visit your Club frequently and bring your friends and potential new members. As with a commercial restaurant, we need a certain volume of business to cover our costs of providing our bar and kitchen service. Cost control is important, but we also need your business to generate the dollars we need to support the level of service appropriate for our Club and one that members have come to expect.

Another of our objectives this year to increase the level of what I call "club dress". No, I am not referring to your personal attire, or the uniforms that our Board and Past Commodores wear. Club dress refers to the attire of our staff, and the facility itself. We want the Club to be clean, neat, and orderly at all times. Of course, after a party or event some time is required to put things together again, but our standards for house and grounds appearance and maintenance will be stressed this year. Vice Commodore Steve Harris was appointed to the position of House and Grounds Governor for a reason related to my personal priority this year to

improve the appearance of your Club. A full time housekeeping and maintenance person has been hired. Most of you know Chuck Fadley, better known as just Chuck or Chucky. We will be saving budget dollars with this consolidation of maintenance and housekeeping; and hopefully, also provide the foundation for a higher standard. Chuck is versatile and a hard worker. A new floor is being installed in the Commodore's Lounge men's room that will help maintain that area within the club dress standard that Vice Commodore Harris and I have established. Your comments and suggestions regarding club dress will be appreciated, including an attaboy or two for Chuck. Welcome back, Chuck!

As of our October Board meeting, I have appointed two committees to address our porch renovation project, and a Jr. Sailing/Children's use of the Club and the second floor pool room. Updates will follow in subsequent Logs.

Speaking of the porch, our goal is to have a refurbished porch ready for next summer. I want to express my sincere appreciation to the Auxiliary for their donation of \$2000 for the porch project and new carpeting, and Commodore Thompson's initiative to establish the need for porch renovation last year.

Another special thanks needs to be extended to Henry Bell for his donation of a big screen replacement TV for the Fireplace Room. Thank you, Henry.

Donations such as that by the Auxiliary and Henry are the reason that I am honored to be your Commodore representing a membership that takes

Bar & Kitchen

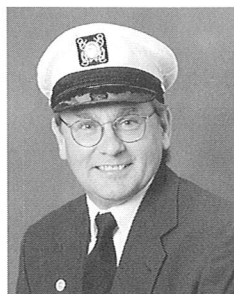

Sunday was a slower day, but we still had good weather, and managed to get our fifth race in, in spite of challenging wind conditions.
